Early Returns Indicate Success of Democratic Candidate

School Bill Carries

At 9:30 the Compulsory Educational Measure was running about 300 votes ahead throughout the state on incomplete counts. These figures are coming from precincts considered to be strongholds of the opponents of the bill. Reports from two Tillamook county precincts complete are: Cloverdale, yes 113, no 50; Netarts, yes 1, no 12.

Incomplete returns from several precincts in Tillamook county give the school bill wide majority at 9:45.

At 10:30 the school bill was running strong throughout state, and it seems to be gathering strength in the state. This measure will probably win three to one in Tillamook county from present figures.

Returns are coming in very slowly from the county but the precincts that have sent in complete returns on the school bill report as follows: Netarts yes 1, no 12; Cloverdale, yes 113, no 50; Tillamook, yes 89, no 37; Long Prairie, yes 24, no 24; Carnahan, yes 66, no 15. Outside of Multnomah county 15 precincts complete out of 1729 give for the Compulsory Education bill: yes, 784. No. 752. Compulsory Education bill: yes 3247. No. 2857.
