and crowds watched for returns late into Tuesday night.

Reports began coming in over the Headlight's leased wire as early as seven o'clock but they were mostly from eastern states and returns from Oregon precincts did not start coming over the wire until about 9 o'clock. The Headlight had planned an extra to be on the streets about 9, but the slowness of the returns prevented this. The first edition appeared about 11 o'clock, followed at 6 o'clock Wednesday morning by another, giving complete returns up to that time. The Headlight election extras beat all other papers with the news to Tillamook by at least eight hours, and conveyed a service to Tillamook people that seemed to be appreciated.

In the last edition the Headlight predicted a majority of 36,000 votes for Pierce and as the count progresses it appears that this may be substantiated. It was also predicted that the school bill would pass by 18,000, which may also occur.

Bulletins from the Headlight leased wire were furnished to several places in the city Tuesday night.
