SALUTE THE FLAG

Last Saturday Tillamook city celebrated Armistice day. One of the features was a parade in which the American flag was carried at the head of the column.
Five years ago, when the flag was saluted, it would have been dangerous to fail to recognize it. Saturday not one in ten of the civilians passing the parade took any notice of the emblem of the American nation passing them.
During the days of 1917-18 any man in civilian clothing who did not remove his hat when the flag passed would have had it removed from him, and he would have probably had other consequences besides.
Why this failure to salute the American flag passed unnoticed by the people?

What is the reason for this lack of respect? Is it because we are less patriotic than we were during the war? Is it because that the spark of patriotism that burned within every one of us during the World War has died out? Or is it that now, when an emergency exists, there is a feeling that the flag can take care of itself without any mark of respect being shown?
