LET THE PEOPLE IN

It is always possible to hear some condemnation of the actions of public officials, for the position of one in a public office is open to criticism by everybody.

Such a condition now exists in regard to the taxpayers of this county and the county court. Many people of Tillamook are wondering why taxes are so high; why the county is now in debt; and where the money is spent that is received from taxes. Aside from the bills allowed by the commissioners' court being published each month there is no record being made public of the expenditure of the taxpayers' money. This results in some apprehension on the part of many of the people of Tillamook county regarding the different funds derived from taxation.

The county court is doubtless putting the public money to the best possible use that could be found for it, but that doesn't prevent many inquiries being sent in the direction of that body.

Your writer suggests that the county court publish, periodically, a concise statement of the amount in dollars that is being done in each of the road districts, in so far as it is possible, in each of the projects within these districts. This would involve very little extra expense in

compilation and arrangement and would result in a much better understanding between the taxpayers and the court.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TILLAMOOK CITY, TILLAMOOK COUNTY, STATE OF OREGON, that the following proposed amendment to the charter of said City be and the same hereby is proposed for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection at the special city election to be held on the 18th day of December, 1922, as in this resolution, provided:

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL

An Act

To amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the City of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith" filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893, as amended by the legal voters at an election held July 10, 1919, and to amend all subsequent acts amending said act adopted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF TILLAMOOK CITY that an act entitled "An act to incorporate the City of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 13, 1893, and as amended by the legal voters at an election held July 10, 1919, and as amended by all subsequent acts amending said act adopted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto Chapter X to read as follows:

CHAPTER X For the purpose of granting to the General Staff of the National Guard

of Oregon all of Block 1, Maple Grove Addition, and to exchange lot 1, Block 3 Maple Grove Addition for Lot 5 Block 1 Maple Grove Addition contingent upon an Armory being constructed upon said Block 1, Maple Grove Addition.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that for the hereinabove proposed charter amendment, the following ballot title be and the same hereby is adopted, to-wit:

CHARTER AMENDMENT SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL

An Act

To amend the charter of the City of Tillamook City, filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893 and to amend all subsequent amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people by adding Chapter X authorizing the granting to the General Staff of the National Guard of Oregon all of Block 1 Maple Grove Addition, and to exchange Lot 1, Block 3 Maple Grove Addition for Lot 5 Block 1 Maple Grove Addition, contingent upon an Armory being constructed upon said Block 1, Maple

RESOLVED FURTHER that this resolution for proposed charter amendment submitted to the voters by the Council be filed with the Recorder of Tillamook City for submission to the legal voters of said City at a special election which shall be and here by is called to be held on the 18th day of December, 1922. The polls for the receipt of ballots shall be open at the hour of 8 o'clock a.m. and closed at the hour of 8 o'clock p.m. on the foresaid date.

The following named place, to-wit: City Hall be and the same is hereby designated as the polling place for said election, and the following named be and they hereby are designated and appointed as and for Judges and Clerks of election, to-wit: at said polling place for said election on said date, to-wit:

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the

Recorder be and she hereby is instructed and required to publish the hereinabove proposed charter amendment submitted to the legal voters by the Council in the manner required by law; that is to say, by publication of this resolution in full in the Tillamook Herald, a newspaper published in Tillamook City, in two consecutive weekly issues, the first publication to be within the thirty days preceding the election, and the last publication to be at least fifteen days prior to the said special election.
