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NOTE AND COMMENT

The year just coming to a close has been kind to Tillamook county, and our citizens can look back with satisfaction on the record of progress made.

The work of permanent road building, probably the most important feature in the continued progress of the county, has gone steadily forward during the year.

Building operations have kept pace with other activities, payrolls have been greatly extended, and the basic industries, timber and dairying, are on a more substantial basis than ever before.

So, with this record behind us, and mindful of the great natural resources which make of Tillamook county a land of exceptional opportunity, we can face the new year confident that it will be one of the best in the history of this section.

Tillamook is to be congratulated upon the recent organization here of a Kiwanis Club. Its record of achievement elsewhere leaves no doubt that the forward-looking influence exerted by the club will have an immediate effect upon the civic and business life of the community.

Regardless of political affiliation people will applaud any attempt made by the new administration to reduce taxes. Taxpayers are more interested in results than in ways and means and it is hoped that proponents of the several plans suggested will not get into a deadlock to the end that nothing will be accomplished.

WHAT IS YOUR REACTION TIME?

"What is your reaction time or do you know the value of your personal equation?"

This has been suggested as a possible question to be put to applicants for motor vehicle driver's license, according to the Bureau of Public Roads of the Department of Agriculture. Reaction time is the interval of time that elapses between the instant a sign or signal is seen and the necessary action started.

Every astronomer who observes when a star crosses a hair line in his telescope and presses a key so that the time may be electrically recorded knows that he does not observe the fact and press the key at the same time. A correction has to be made which has been carefully determined and is called his personal equation.

RESPECT FOR THE FLAG

County Superintendent Lamb suggests that the following statement by Alvin M. Owsley, of Texas, National Director, Americanism Commission, American Legion, on the above, entitled subject is worthy of very careful study by the pupils of every school room in Tillamook County and suggests that the teachers make use of this as reading lesson, a lesson in writing, a lesson in language, a lesson in history, and a lesson in citizenship and patriotism and for the cultivation of the true meaning of the American flag and what it stands for.

It is hoped that when school exercises are being prepared in connection with the celebration of Washington's birthday, etc., that some pupil or pupils in every school will commit to memory and recite this lesson on "Respect For the Flag."

"When you see the Stars and Stripes displayed, stand up and take off your hat. Somebody may titter. It is in the blood of some to deride all expression of noble sentiment. You may blaspheme in the street and stagger drunken in public places, and the bystanders will not pay much attention to you, but if you should get down on your knees and pray Almighty God, or if you should stand bareheaded while a company of old soldiers marches by with the flags to the breeze, some people will think you are showing off."

"But don't you mind! When Old Glory comes along, salute, and let them think what they please! When the hand plays the Star Spangled Banner in a restaurant or hotel dining room, get up, even if you rise alone; stand there, don't be ashamed of it, either."

"Don't be ashamed when your throat chokes and the tears come when you see the flag flying from the masts of our ships on the great seas or floating from every flagstaff of the Republic. You will never have a worthier emotion. For of all the signs and symbols since the world began there is none so full of meaning as the flag of this country."

"Other flags mean a glorious past; this flag means a glorious future. It is not so much the flag of our fathers as it is the flag of our children, and of countless children yet unborn. It is the flag of tomorrow, the signal of the 'good time coming.' It is not the flag of your king; it is the flag of yourself and your neighbors."

Your flag stands for humanity, for an equal opportunity, to all the sons of men. Of course, we have not yet arrived at that goal; injustice still dwells among us; senseless and cruel customs of the past still cling to us, but the flag leads the way to righting the wrongs of men."

"Our flag is the world's symbol of liberty. That piece of red, white and blue bunting means five thousand years of struggle upwards. It is the full grown flower of generations of fighting for liberty. It is the century plant of human hope in bloom."

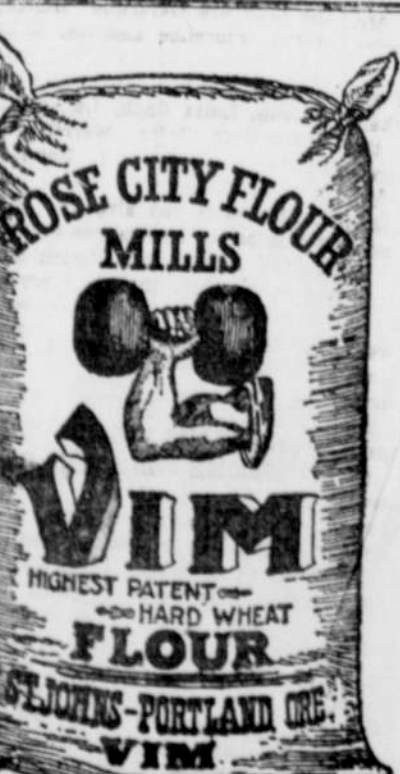
