**NOTICE OF DRAINAGE HEARING**  
To the Owners and All persons interested in the lands corporate and other property in and adjacent to Tillamook Drainage District: You, and each of you, are hereby notified that the Board of Supervisors of Tillamook Drainage District of Tillamook County, Oregon, has filed in the office of the County Clerk of Tillamook County, Oregon, a petition praying the County Court to amend the decree entered by the County Court of said County on the 21st day of February, 1919, wherein and whereby it was ordered that the boundaries of said Drainage District be extended by including therein certain lands in Tillamook county, Oregon, situate in Tillamook county, Oregon, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 30 feet east of the west line of Section 31 in Township 1 south of Range 9 west, W. M. and 30 rods south of the northwest corner of said section, said point being the northwest corner of the original Tillamook Drainage District, as described in the petition therefor, and running thence north to the north line of said Section 31; thence east to the west line of Third Avenue east, in Tillamook City, Oregon, and running thence north to a point 60 feet west of the southwest corner of Block 30

of Thayer's Addition to Tillamook City, Oregon; thence east along the south line of said Thayer's Addition, and an extension thereof, to the southeast corner of Block 16, of A. A. Miller to the town of Tillamook City, Oregon; thence southwest corner of said Block 16; thence east to the corner of Block 15; and thence north to the northeast corner of Block 15; thence north to the east corner of Block 15; thence east to the east line of Lot 4 in Block 15, according to the plat thereof; thence south 100 feet south of the south line of Goodspeed's Park; thence northeast corner of Block 15; thence north to the west line of said High Street; thence south to the east line of Section 31 aforesaid, 300 feet; thence north 100 or less, to the north line of Drainage District, as established; thence west to the beginning of Reference Land Addition all as recorded plat thereof, by striking out the lands and amendments of incorporation of said lands included in the order above mentioned, of 21st, 1919, shall no longer be a part of said District, and thereupon the boundaries of such District be the same shall be as were set out in the original decree for the incorporation of said District, or on the contrary on or before the day of March, 1923, the Tillamook County Court, on Wednesday, the 7th day of March, 1923, at ten o'clock P.
