

**NOTICE OF SHERIFF'S SALE**

Notice is hereby given that by virtue of a writ of attachment execution issued out of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Tillamook County, upon a judgment and order of sale in favor of the United States National Bank of Portland (Oregon) a corporation, plaintiff, and against Rudolph Zweifel, defendant, I will sell at public auction to the highest bidder for cash in hand the following described real property situate in Tillamook County, Oregon, to-wit:

**Notice of Filing Commissioners' Report for Dougherty Slough Drainage District**

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested in the land included within the Dougherty Slough Drainage District in Tillamook County, Oregon, the boundaries of which District are as follows:

Beginning at a point on the south bank of Wilson river distant 400 feet due east from the west line of Section 21, Township 1 south Range 9 West, W. 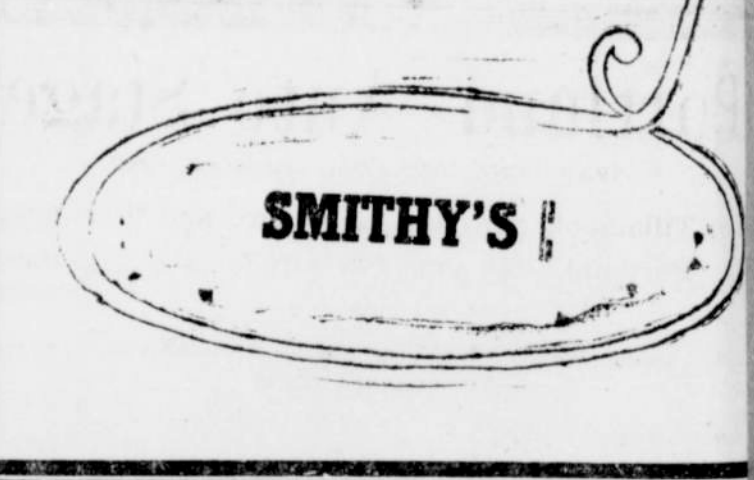
