Notice of Filing Commissioners' Report for Dougherty Slough Drainage District

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested in the land included within the Dougherty Slough Drainage District in Tillamook County, Oregon, the boundaries of which District are as follows:

Beginning at a point on the south bank of Wilson River distant 400 feet due east from the west line of Section 21, Township 1 south Range 9 west, W. M., and running thence south to the quarter Section line east

and west through said Section 21; thence west along the quarter Section line running east and west through said Section 21, to the quarter Section corner on the west line of said Section 21; thence south along west line of Section 21, to the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 20, in said Township and Range; thence west along the one sixteenth Section line to the Southwest corner of the Northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 20, said Township and Range; thence south along the west line of said Section 20 to the southwest corner of Section 20; thence west along south line of Section 19, of said Township and Range to the quarter Section corner on the south line of said Section 19, said Township and Range; thence south along the quarter section line running north and south through the center of Section 30, in said Township and Range to the north bank of Hoquarion Slough; thence west along the north bank of said Hoquarion Slough through said Section 30, Township 1 south of Range 9 west and through Sections 25 and 24 of Township 1 south of Range 10 west of Willamette Meridian, to where the north bank of said Hoquarion Slough intersects the south line of Section 24, in Township 1 south of Range 10 west; thence east along the south line of said Section 24 to the southwest corner of the southeast quarter of southwest quarter of Section 24; thence north along the one sixteenth Section line to the center of Hall's Slough; thence following the center of Hall's Slough in a northwesterly direction to its intersection with the east and west line running through the center of said Section 24; thence east along the quarter Section line running east and west through the center of said Section 24 and continuing along said line on the quarter section line running east and west through the center of Section 19, in Township 1 south of Range 9 west of W. 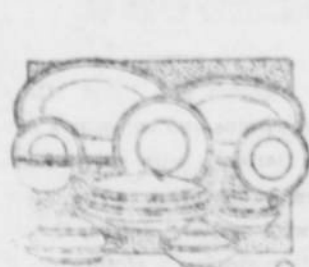

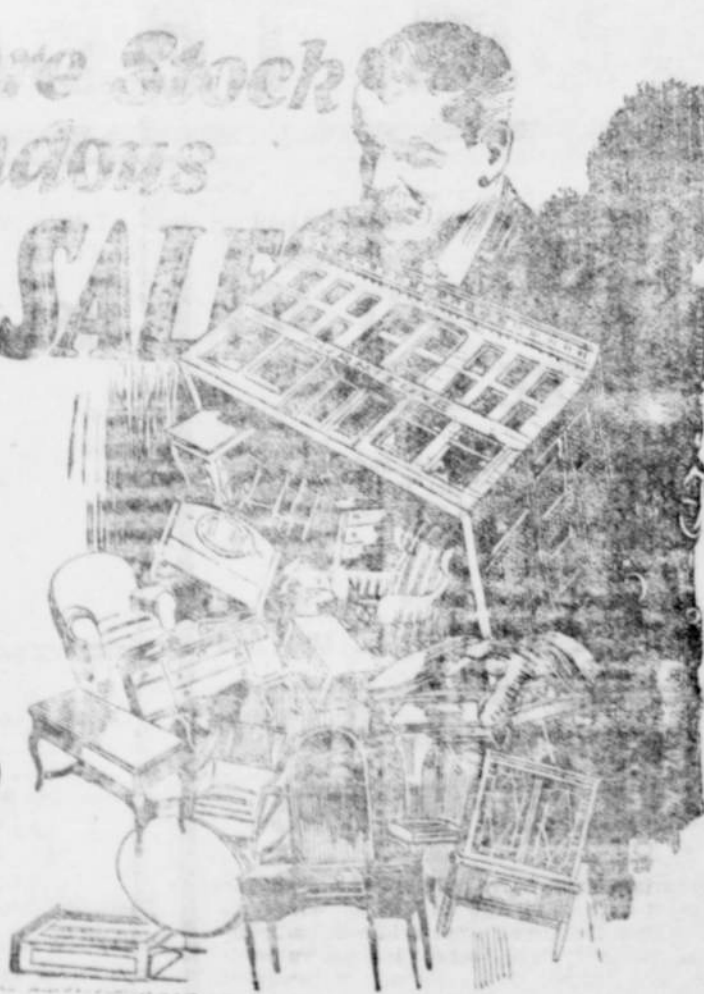
