

OREGON INDUSTRIAL NOTES

Salem to have a Henry Ford assembling plant.

Pendleton—Sheep shearers to receive 12 1-2 cents per head and board.

Astoria—57,612,006 feet of lumber went out in ships in February.

Eugene—First of two bridges to be erected by city over mill race on Pacific highway will be bridge on Franklin.

Eugene—24 car loads fruit shipped in two months.

Vernonia to build new water system at cost of \$26,278.20.

Eugene—Plans for athletic building program including terraced tract of 14 city blocks, containing facilities for varsity and intramural baseball, football, soccer; a gymnasium and at least 20 tennis courts under way.

Clatskanie—\$1500 publication to advertise Columbia county planned.

Florence—Electric light company will erect power plant on Sweet creek.

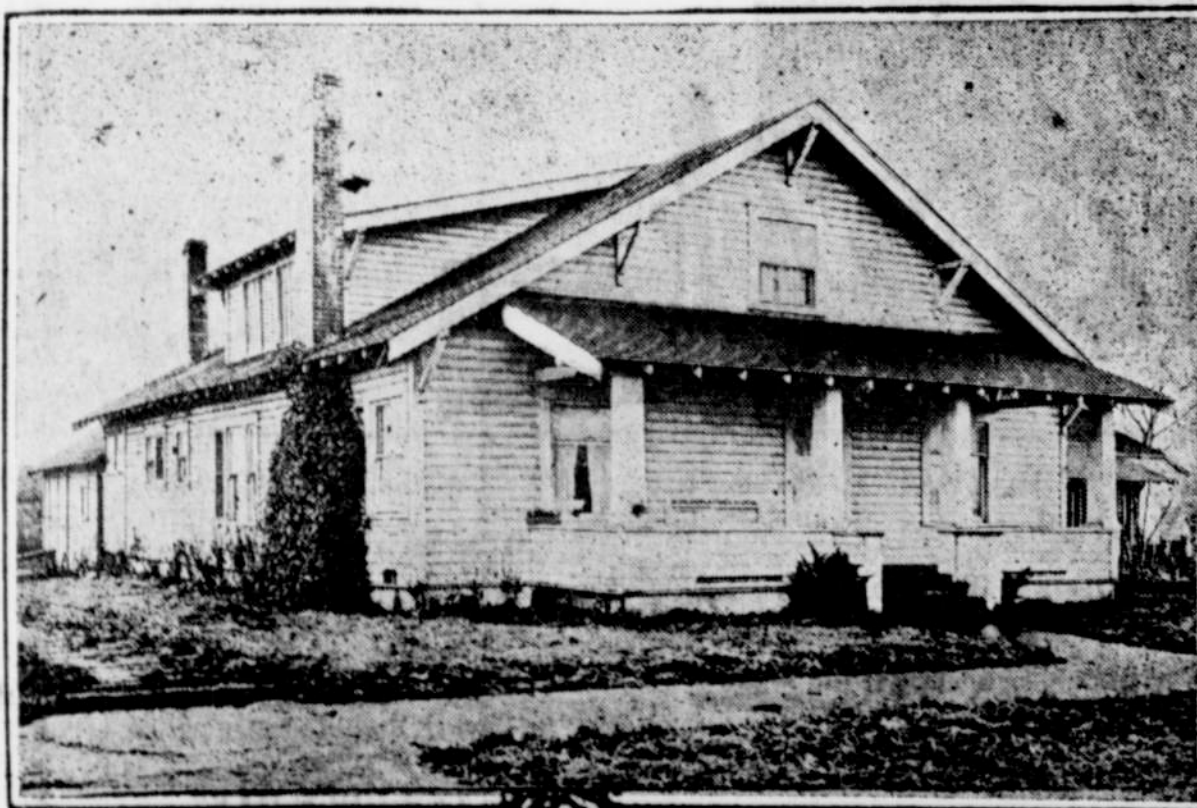
