RUSS HAVE NEW COURT SYSTEM

Supreme Tribunal, With Seat at Moscow, to Have Criminal, Civil and Appeal Branches.

Moscow.—The revolutionary tribunals which, along with the dreaded "cheka," were instruments of Red terror during the worst period of the bolshevist revolution...

While founded upon lines not unlike those of the court systems of some other European countries, the new Russian courts have some particularly communitarian features all their own.

The Supreme court of Russia, which will sit in Moscow, will have three branches. One will be for criminal cases, one for civil and the other a court of appeal.

Peter Stuchka, Lethian lawyer, who gained fame as the bolshevist dictator of Latvia when Riga was in the hands of the communists, has been named as chairman of the Supreme court.

M. Kursky, commissar of justice, will be chief procurator or attorney general in the new court system, but the active prosecutor will be Vladimir Krytenko...

New Jury System. A peculiar feature of the new system is that a species of "juror" is introduced.

There will be two of them in each case, sitting beside the judge and having full powers to question witnesses and attorneys. They will retire with the judge to deliberate upon the case.

When the new court system is in full swing, it is expected that most of the lawyers appearing will be men trained in the law courts of the old regime.

Professional unions of lawyers are being organized, subject to the approval of the soviet authorities.

USUALLY FOLLOWS FLU

Surgeon General Cummings Tells About Sleeping Sickness.

Washington.—While reports of cases of "sleeping sickness" are reaching the Public Health Service from various parts of the country, Surgeon General Hugh S. Cummings said that the service had no statistics sufficiently reliable to warrant a statement as to the extent of the disease throughout the United States.

"Encephalitis lethargica, or sleeping sickness, as it is popularly known, is reportable by physicians in only comparatively few states," said the surgeon general.

"The Lord has been wanting me to tell it for all these years, and I am afraid He won't forgive me for not telling it," reads the affidavit of Mrs. James Brown, the dying wife of the man for whose alleged murder Tidwell passed twenty-five years in prison...

Dr. H. F. Smith of the public health service, of the 1918-19 epidemic, 22 per cent of the supposed cases had to be excluded as being really cerebrospinal meningitis, cerebral syphilis, brain abscess, tuberculosis meningitis, epilepsy, poliomyelitis, hysteria, or acute alcoholism.

"The disease appears to be only difficultly communicable. Not a single secondary case is known to have occurred in the immediate families of the patients reported in 1918-19, although some 900 persons were exposed.

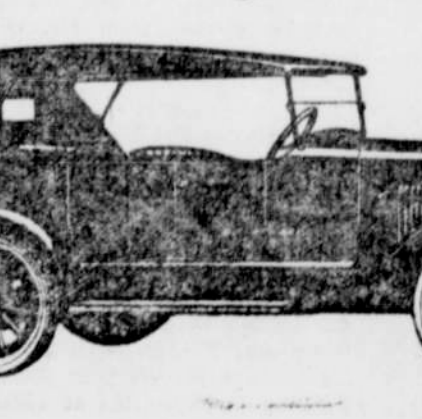
