TILLAMOOKER ARRESTED IN DALLAS

Wm. Zurcher, whose home is on

the Miami river, when at home, was arrested over in Dallas, Polk county, one day last week by the sheriff of that county while looking the town over. Deputy Sheriff Lucas went over to Dallas last Saturday and on Sunday brought Zurcher back here and placed him in jail. Zurcher was arraigned before Justice Stanley Monday last and pleaded not guilty to a charge of unlawful manufacture of intoxicating liquor. BOY SHOOT'S COWS

On Tuesday last Dwayne Imlah, a 14-year-old boy of Cloverdale, armed himself with a 25-30 repeating rifle and opened fire on some dairy cows belonging to Frank Owens and Ivan Gist. Two of the cattle have since died and five others bear wounds from the effects of the bullets. Imlah was brought up to Tillamook and on Wednesday he was examined before County Judge Homer Mason. Imlah confessed that he alone had done the shooting, and exonerated two playmates who were with him earlier in the day. The Judge sentenced the boy to the state reform school until he becomes of age. The boy is a son of Alex Imlah, a resident of Cloverdale.

CARRIER NOTTINGHAM IN BAY

The carrier Nottingham, which has been expected to arrive in the bay for some time past, came in Monday of this week and anchored near the big Whitney mills at Garibaldi. She came down from Seattle and will load with a million feet of lumber destined for California ports. Two barges are in port, and the lumber will be loaded on them and thence be transported to the gas freighter. It is expected that it will take about ten days to load the Nottingham. When the boat came in, the mill shut down, and all Garibaldi was out at points of vantage to see the first ship that has entered the bay for many years. One man counted 125 autos lined up from outside points whose owners had come from various parts of the bay section to view the incoming vessel. It is said that this port has not been visited by a large lumber carrier since one of the Dollar fleet came in about 15 years ago.

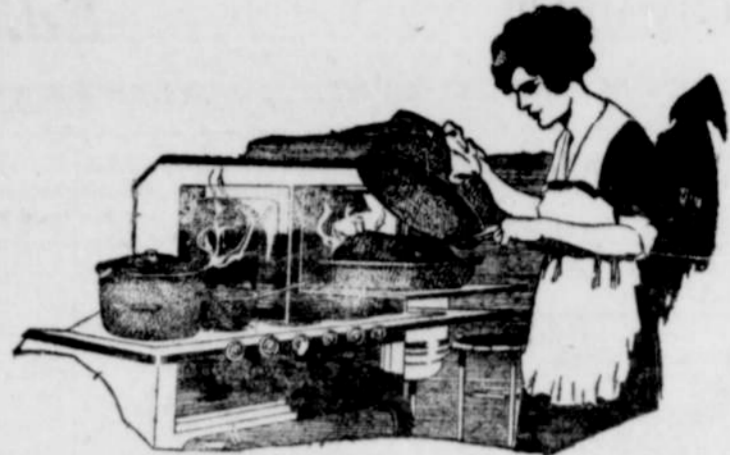
