## FACTORIES IMPROVE

Lincoln county has two co-operative cheese factories located on the St. Lawrence river, which are doing well, according to reports. That county is behind Tillamook county in cheese production, in fact so far, that it is only never to catch up, but it is making a start in the right direction. The rural conditions are just as good as anywhere here.

## 5 ACRES IN LOGANBERRIES

H. Bunn estimates that there are 75 acres set to loganberries in his county, small and large. Mr. Bunn was among the first to introduce the loganberry in this county, bringing the plants in from Mission Bottom farm owned by Lafollett, Marion county, and plant them on his ranch near Beaver in county. The loganberry attains its greatest perfection on the Coast, where it gets plenty of the needed moisture. A movement is on among growers of the state to publish and advertise this excellent berry, and it has been proposed to set a fund for the above purpose among the growers of the state. Oregon and Washington are the two best for the production of the loganberry although the berry was originally introduced by the man whose it bears—Logan. Owing to its composition, the loganberry will stand long shipment, and most berries raised on the northwest are either canned here, or the is extracted and then shipped where it finds a good market. As a berry it is hard to beat and has local demand, but it requires handling to prevent mold and

Frank Bester, another pioneer farmer of this county, has also cast his lot with the loganberry. Mr. Bester is raising some time ago and now quite an acreage of the berry. He is confident of every successful future for the berry raising in this county.
