MILE ROAD READY FOR ROCK

It is reported that a mile of the road between Mohler and the Clatsop county line is now ready for rocking and that the big rock crusher in Clatsop county, about a mile from the county line, is about ready to grind

rock for the Tillamook county end of the work. Work in this county is going ahead at a rapid rate up on the stretch of road above referred to, and crews will place the crushed rock as fast as it can be had.

EARLY TILLAMOOK TRAILS

Few people who travel the present fine Tillamook roads of today from Portland in to the capital of the county, and elsewhere along our beaches, realize how the pioneers of this section got in and out of the coast section. And few even give it a thought, as they eat up the miles in their fine, swift automobiles, over scenic highways, with towns and hamlets appearing and disappearing, every few miles.

In Tillamook is a citizen whose father built the first horse trail from Tillamook to McMinnville in 1865, in the closing days of the great civil war. A. H. Harris of this city was born one half mile above the old Quick place on South Prairie, 53 years ago and is therefore one of the few pioneers' sons now living.

son remembers that the above families included the Trasks, Vaughns, and the Quicks; the others he does not recall.

There were a few times when the Indians were, or pretended to be mad, but no harm came to the little handful of settlers then in the country. Mr. Harris senior, used to settle disputes among the Indians and was well esteemed by the natives who regarded him as their "tillicum" or friend.

He recalls that for six weeks at one time the only food that was served in his home was salmon, boiled, fried or roasted, and potatoes; bread being a luxury not to be obtained during that period. The old timers could not get supplies such as flour and sugar and coffee, except by schooners that came from Portland and Astoria.
