Interesting figures were brought recently by a local farmer who had taken the trouble to count up. These figures were a surprise. The values in this county are in automobiles and cattle. While the figures given were approximately considered close enough

to bring home to Tillamook county people a few interesting facts. There are in this county about 1300 head of cattle used in the dairy business at a fair average value of \$60 per head; total value \$69,000. From other sources comes the information that there are 1600 automobiles in Tillamook county at an average value of \$1000 each, making a total value of these machines around \$1,600,000 there being nearly twenty-four times more money invested in automobiles than there is in the mainstays of our community, the milk cows. These figures are offered here simply as a comparison and not as a criticism, for no one nowadays belittles the practicability of automotive machines as a necessary part of modern life. However it would seem that there is some discrepancy in the values of these two classes of property in Tillamook.

This variety is found along the coast while others of the species inhabit the mountain ranges to the east and all are pleasing singers.
