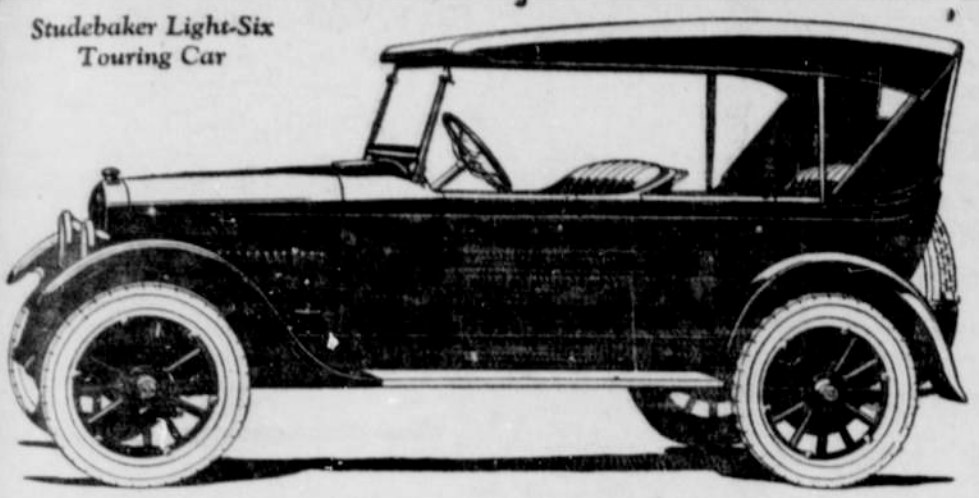

ARMY MASK HAS NEW FEATURES

Makes It Possible for Officers to Give Orders in Battle Without Removal.

Washington.—The chemical warfare service of the army has developed a new gas mask so constructed as to enable the wearer to carry on conversation while using it and thus making it possible for officers to give orders in battle without removing it.

Wearer Can Talk. The new mask has a sort of diaphragm attachment somewhat similar in appearance to that used on phonographs. By means of it the wearer of the mask can carry on conversation with about 80 per cent of the efficiency of the average speaking voice.

Other New Features.

There are also features embraced in the construction of the new "all-purpose" canister that lessen air resistance and reduce the distress of breathing to practically a negligible quantity.
