

NEW PICTURE SHOW TO BE OPENED SOON

Partridge & Morrison, proprietors of the picture show in this city, expect to move into their new building at the A. G. Beals building in the early part of the coming September. The new quarters have been leased for a long period and are being fitted according to the special requirements of the lessees. The building

which will be occupied by the picture firm is 47x102 feet over all. The auditorium is 47x70 feet; and will seat 525 persons and the balcony, about 170 more. The ceiling of the auditorium is about 22 feet from the side walk level and 27 feet at the lowest level. A men's lounging room is 11x16 feet; a ladies rest room is 11x16 with accommodations. In a room 8x8 is the generator and the electric appliances. Another small room also upstairs, will be used for storage purposes.

The operating room is 8x12 feet. There are two upstairs entrances to the balcony from the mezzanine floor. The auditorium and balcony will each have the latest theatre opera chairs. The picture screen will be of the latest creation—Gardner's velvet gold fibre—and one of the best. Fire escapes will be adequate for the safety of the public and will comply fully with the state laws governing. The main foyer floor and the aisles and mezzanine

floor will be covered with double weight theatre carpet. The new \$10,000 Smith unit pipe organ is now being installed. It is one of the best. The ceiling and walls will be decorated with oil hand work by a Portland decorator. Mr. Ammer, who did similar work for the Liberty theatre of Portland, and others. All aisles opening to the stage will be draped with heavy plush velvet in old rose color.

The front of the new theatre will be covered with a marquis and electric flasher sign. A heating and ventilating system is being installed of the Anderson type of forced circulation, which will supply a complete change of air every four minutes, which is in itself a decided healthful innovation. The ventilator will be automatically controlled by thermostat installation. The lights will be of the latest improved types used in the best theatres. All lights will be controlled by electric dimmers, permitting change of colors and intensity, all controlled by switches in the projection booth. In the front part of the room, on either side, will be located the flower gardens which will add materially to the beauty and scenic effect of the interior of the auditorium and balcony.

The appointments of the new theatre have recently attracted the attention of theatre proprietors from several parts of the state, and the general verdict is that the local proprietors will have one of the most modern theatres in the state.

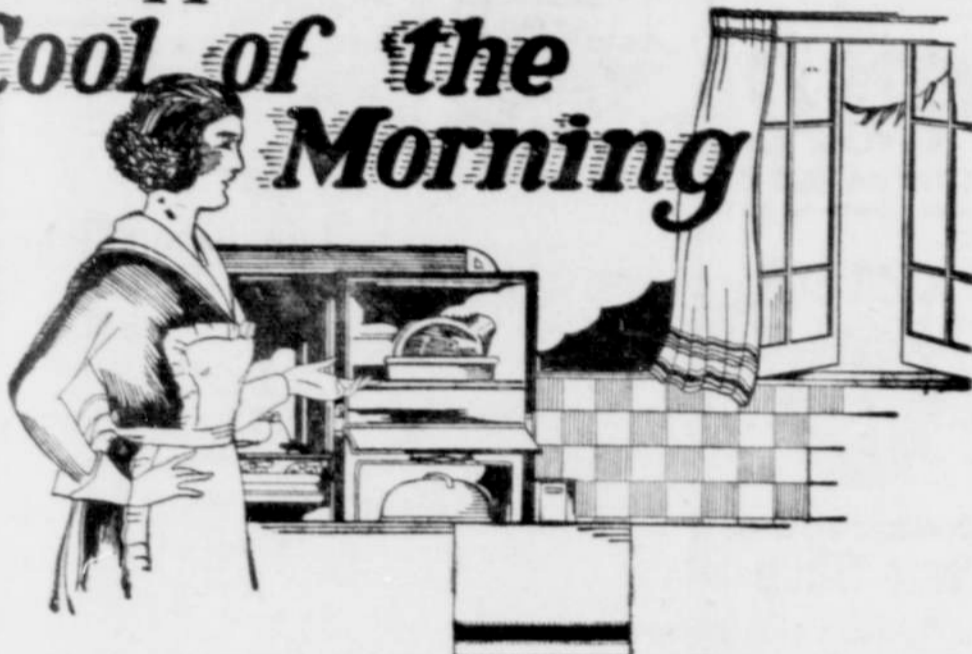

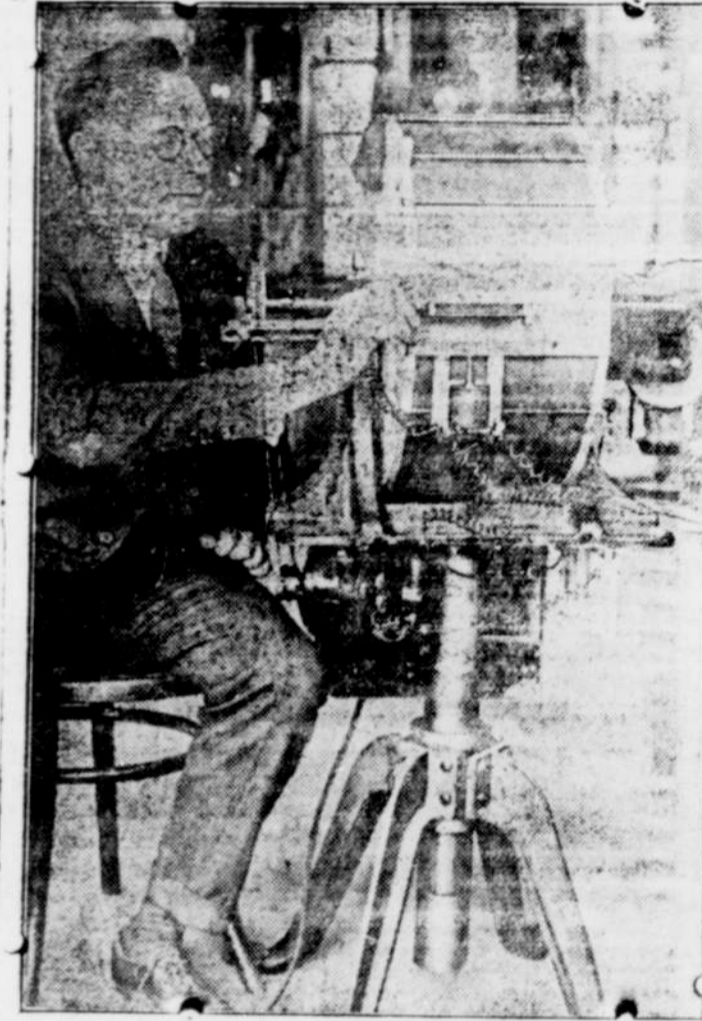

LIGHTHOUSE WITHOUT KEEPER—TO GUIDE PLANES

This shows the Airway lighthouse at Tatsfield, England, which guides the Croydon-Paris airplanes across the Channel at night. This lighthouse throws a beam of light to reach Lympe in Kent, and is only visited twice a year. The lights are supplied with gas from the cylinders below. There is a patent device on the top which automatically lights the lamps when the sun goes down. The lights are so arranged that when the sun comes up again the lights automatically are switched off and are lighted in the same manner on dull or cloudy days.
