to 1919, when the work was halted. Last Spring, however, reforestation was again taken up, and a total of 2,000 acres have been planted to Douglas firs, mainly in the vicinity of Mt. Hebo, a prominent elevation in this county, southeast of Tillamook.

There never has been a fire in this plantation, but the truth remains, that if a fire were to occur, it would mean the loss of the small trees. Trees planted in 1912 are now from 12 to 15 feet in height, and furnish limbs sufficiently large for mattresses for the beds of workmen.

There are eight guard stations in the district, all of which are furnished with telephones, good horse trails, and fire finding apparatus. A standard lookout cabin has just been completed on the apex of Mt. Hebo, which is 3165 feet above sea level, and has a commanding view of the surrounding country.

The Miami and Spalding lumber companies have two lookout stations which form bearing points in the work from the Hebo station. Look-out reports are phoned into the central office at Hebo, and the man in charge of the cabin there determines from the reports, just where the fire is; and he in turns phones to the station nearest the fire.

While riding the chains that convey lumber from the yards to the dry kiln last Thursday, at the Whitney Mill, at Garibaldi Cove, Paul Kassen, a young man employed at the mills, had both legs broken and an arm fractured by allowing his clothing to get caught in the shaft that drives the chains. He was also severely bruised besides his other injuries. A ladder is provided for escape, when the carrier becomes clogged, but Kassen failed to avail himself of the ladder, so it is stated.
