(c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to vehicles engaged in construction of state highways or county roads when the movement of such vehicles is confined wholly to such roads or section of roads actually under construction and not yet open to unlimited public use; provided, that such vehicles must first obtain from the state highway commission a permit in writing allowing such operation. (Laws 1921, Special Session, Chap. 8, Sec. 4.)

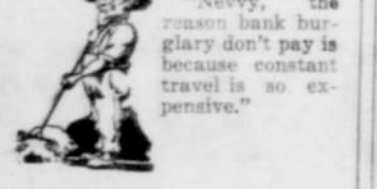
