MOTOR VEHICLE LAWS

any other county, state or territory shall, not later than seventy-two hours after commencing to operate or to cause or permit said motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer to be operated on any public highway within this state, apply to the secretary of state of this state, or such agency as may have been designated by said secretary of state for registration of such vehicle, said application to be made upon a form to be prepared and furnished on request by the secretary of state, which application shall state in addition to such other matters as may be required by the secretary of state the name and postoffice and residence address of the applicant, together with the registration or license number of said motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer assigned thereto in the county, state or territory in which same is then registered, which county, state or territory shall be designated in said application. Upon receipt of said application the secretary of state, if satisfied as to the facts stated there in shall without charge furnish to the applicant a registration certificate or device of a distinctive form to be determined by the secretary of state, indicating that the holder thereof has complied with the requirements of this act and containing such other matter as may be deemed suitable by the secretary of state, which certificate or device shall be valid not to exceed three months from the date of its issuance, and not beyond the current calendar year. In case of a motor vehicle, said certificate or device shall be carried at all times while said motor vehicle is being operated or driven upon the public highways in plain sight in or upon said motor vehicle, and in case of a trailer or such certificate or device shall be displayed in such manner as the secretary of state shall prescribe. The secretary of state shall file said applications for registration by nonresident owners in his office and shall suitably index the same, which files and index shall be open to inspection by the public during reasonable business hours. The secretary of state is hereby authorized and empowered to designate and appoint and maintain convenient agencies for the purpose of carrying into force and effect the provisions of this section. Before any foreign licensed motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer shall be operated over the highways of this state for compensation or profit, the same shall be registered and licensed in this state in the same manner as is required in the case of motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers not therefore registered or licensed; provided, however, that when it is desired to operate any such vehicle in this state for compensation or profit for a period not to exceed three months in any calendar year, if such vehicle is then duly registered and licensed under the laws of any other county, state or territory, the owner of such vehicle shall make application to the secretary of state of this state in the manner and form prescribed by that official for the registration and licensing of such vehicle for the period of time during which it is desired to operate the same in this state, which application shall be accompanied by a fee in an amount equal to one-twelfth of the full annual license fee applicable to said vehicle as prescribed in this act for each month or fraction thereof said vehicle is to be so operated in this state during said three months' period, and the secretary of state, if satisfied as to the facts therein stated, shall register and license such vehicle for the

period stated in such application and assigned thereto an appropriate license plate emblem or device, which shall at all times be displayed upon such vehicle, in the manner prescribed by the secretary of state, when operated or driven upon the roads and highways of this state during the period of the life of such license; provided further, that any such motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer shall be subject to all laws, rules and regulations governing the operation of such vehicle on the highways of the state of Oregon. Except as in this section otherwise provided, the registration number plates assigned and furnished to any foreign licensed motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer for the current calendar year by the county, state or territory where same is licensed, shall be displayed on such motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer substantially as provided in this act for vehicles registered pursuant to the provisions thereof; provided further, that a foreign corporation doing business in this state shall, for the purpose of this act, be considered a resident of this state and shall make application to the secretary of state of this state, upon regular blanks provided for such purpose, to license such motor vehicles as may be used by such foreign corporation doing business in this state. Upon the purchase, by a resident of this state, of a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, motor bus or bus trailer registered under the laws of another country, state, territory or federal district, such license numbers shall be declared void and shall be removed from such vehicle by the owner thereof and such owner shall cause such vehicles to be registered in the manner herein provided for such vehicles owned by residents of this state; provided further, that a resident of this state shall not use herein a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer motor bus or bus trailer registered and licensed under the laws of another country, state, territory or federal district. (Laws 1921, Special Session, Chap. 8, Sec. 12; Laws 1923, Chap. 284, Sec. 1.) Section 38. Models and Weights.—Every manufacturer of a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer or motor bus, sold or offered for sale within this state, either by the manufacturer, distributor, dealer or any other person shall, on or before the first day of August, 1921, and annually thereafter, and at such other times as may be required by the secretary of state file in the office of the secretary of state of this state a sworn statement showing the various models manufactured by him and the weight of each model as of August first of that year, and shall furnish such other information as the secretary of state may require for the efficient administration of this act; provided the secretary of state may accept the weight of any motor vehicle, motor truck, trailer, semitrailer or bus trailer as taken on a scale, which scale has been inspected and sealed by the state sealer of
