the parole board and to circuit court and is free during good behaviour. The boy has only one arm, and looks sickly, and evidently was a victim of bad associates. Maud Hill, who was wanted in the Wilson river liquor case, and who accompanied Vanderpool in the Reeher and Smith burglaries, was fined \$500 and the costs; on each indictment. She was paroled on payment of \$250 and the costs, and was given three months in which to make payment of the fine.

Morris White and George Howard, who were indicted on a charge of grand larceny, were arraigned before the Circuit Judge last Monday, and plead guilty to the charge of stealing 500 grains of morphine from a local hospital in this city, some weeks ago.

The Judge sentenced each of the men to 18 months in the penitentiary. White stole the morphine, and his companion stated that he helped conceal it and jointly used it. Both are victims of the morphine habit. One of the men asked the Judge to send him to the insane asylum until he could get cured of the drug habit, and then he would willingly serve his sentence in the penitentiary. The Judge

explained that he could not accommodate him.

Mae Robinson was arraigned in Circuit Court last Monday, and entered a plea of not guilty to six indictments charging her with larceny by bailer. Her case was set for trial by Judge Bagley to occur on December 3. She was allowed to go until that time on bail previously given.
