prise everybody. And it is coming sooner than you think," said the timberman, as he gazed meditatively at the great array of timber that spread over thousands of acres eastward to the far away summit of the Coast range.

Right here is food for thought. Have the people of Tillamook city and the surrounding bay section given the matter of the future development of the lumber industry in this county the wide view? The writer admits that he had not, up to this time. The average man believes as the writer did, that real timber exploitation necessarily depends upon the extension of the lines of big railroad concerns into this county from the Willamette valley, before great development of the timber industry on the west side of the coast range can begin. The statement of the timberman has exploded that old idea. What Tillamook needs is improvement of the Tillamook bay, so that the prospective billions of feet of lumber can get out to sea, independent of the big railroad systems. Once the bay is improved, then will come the lumber fleet, and it is surprising how much some of those big lumber carriers can take away at a single load.

The key to the whole situation is

the improvement of Tillamook bay. That done, and the lumber output will take care of itself. Mill railroads will get the logs to the mills on the bay, and from these mills, there is but one handling until the manufactured product reaches its destination, be it far or near.

The timberman who keeps waiting for the big railroad companies to build in to or through his timber territory, is a dreamer; and his timber may continue to stand uncut for years to come. The man who has the vision to get results by building his own logging railroads, is a practical exponent of modern methods.

Tillamook must get the needed bar improvements. It is believed that our people are awake to this fact; and now is the time to make our demands, and get "the bacon." Forget the big railroads. The Almighty gave us Tillamook bay. He also gave us the fine bodies of timber, and provided a way to get it out. Evidently the Creator knew what He was doing, and if the created have not the grit, the dogged persistence and sense requisite to make use of the natural means afforded to get our great forests of timber to a market, they will have no one to blame but themselves.

If the people of this county would increase the big lumber pay rolls of this county, and build up this city and other parts of the county, they must

cooperate with the lumber interests in securing improvement of the bay, and thereby help themselves.

The key to the situation is the im-

provement of Tillamook bay. That done, and there will follow timber exploitation undreamed by the most sanguine community booster.
