MOTOR VEHICLE LAWS

of Oregon incurred in carrying out the provisions of this act shall be audited by the secretary of state and paid out of the moneys hereby appropriated upon presentation of duly verified claims thereof after approval by the public service commission of Oregon...

Section 9. Penalties for Violations of Act.—Every officer, agent or employe of any corporation, and every other person who violates or fails to comply with any such order, decision, rule, direction, demand or requirement, or any part or provision thereof of the public service commission of Oregon, or who procures, aids or abets any corporation or person in its failure to observe or comply with any such order, decision, rule, direction, demand or requirement, or any part or provision thereof, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine not exceeding \$1,000, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment...

Section 10. Act Does Not Apply to Interstate Commerce.—Neither this act nor any provision thereof shall apply or be construed to apply to commerce with foreign nations or commerce among the several states of this union except in so far as the same may be permitted under the provisions of the constitution of the United States and the acts of congress. (Laws 1921, Special Session, Chap. 10.)

Section 11. Constitutionality of Act. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this act is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this act. The legislative assembly declares that it would have passed this act and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more other sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional. (Laws 1921, Special Session, Chap. 10.)

OREGON LAWS REGULATING THE DRIVING OF AUTOMOBILES AND OTHER VEHICLES BY INTOXICATED PERSONS AND PERSONS ADDICTED TO DRUNKENNESS

Section 2253-1. Intoxicated Person; Driving Motor Vehicle; Penalty; Chauffeur's License Revoked, When.—(a) Any person operating or driving any automobile, motorcycle or other motor vehicle who becomes or is intoxicated while so engaged in operating such automobile, motorcycle or other motor vehicle, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period of not more than 100 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

(b) In addition to the remedies and punishment hereinbefore prescribed in this act, and upon the conviction for the second violation hereof, it shall be the duty of the judge before whom said person is found guilty to file a certified copy of such judgment of second conviction with the secretary of state and it shall immediately become the duty of the secretary of state to cancel and declare null and void the license so held for the operation of said automobile or other motor vehicle. Or in the event of a chauffeur, the chauffeur license shall be canceled and declared null and void, and hereafter the person so found guilty a second time of operating or driving an automobile or other motor vehicle while in an intoxicated condition shall not have the right to receive any other or further license for the operation or driving of any automobile or other motor vehicle for a period of five years.

(c) If any clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this act shall for any reason be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect impairment nor invalidate the remainder of this act, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 2253-2. Punishment for Causing Injury or Death by Intoxicated Persons Driving Motor Vehicles. Any person operating or driving any automobile, motorcycle or other motor vehicle, who becomes or is intoxicated while so engaged in operating or driving such automobile, motorcycle or other motor vehicle, and who by reason of such intoxication does any act, or neglects any duty imposed by law, which act or neglect of duty causes the death of, or bodily injury to, any person, upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years, or in the county jail for a period of one year, or by fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 2253-3. Persons Addicted to Drunkenness Not to Be Employed as Driver.—No person shall knowingly employ to drive any automobile, motorcycle or other motor vehicle for the conveyance of passengers upon any public highway or street, any person addicted to drunkenness, under penalty of \$10 for every day such person is in his employment.

Section 2253-4. Employer to Discharge Driver if Given Notice of Intoxication of Driver.—If any driver, while actually employed in driving any automobile, motorcycle or other motor vehicle, is intoxicated to such a degree as to endanger the safety of his passengers, the owner of such vehicle, on receiving from any such passenger a written notice of the fact, verified by his oath, must forthwith discharge such driver, and if such owner fails, neglects or refuses to discharge such driver at once, or if he has such driver in his service at any time within six months after the date of the service of such notice, he shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall incur the penalty prescribed in section 2253-1 of this act.

Section 2253-5. Justice's and District Courts Have Jurisdiction.—That for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of sections 2253-1, 2253-3, 2253-4 of this act, all justice of the peace courts and district courts in the state of Oregon, shall be, and they are hereby, given concurrent jurisdiction.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE FORFEITURE AND SALE OF VEHICLES USED IN THE UNLAWFUL TRANSPORTATION OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR

Section 1. Vehicle to Be Forfeited to State, When.—Any boat, vehicle or other conveyance used by or with the knowledge of the owner or the person operating or in charge thereof, in any unlawful bringing of intoxicating liquor into this state, or the unlawful transportation of the same within this state, or in or on which intoxicating liquor or unlawfully possessed in kept or concealed by or with the knowledge of such owner or person operating or in charge thereof, shall be forfeited to the state. Throughout this act the singular shall include the plural number, and vice versa. (Laws 1923, Chap. 29.)

Section 2. Return of Seizure to Be Made to Circuit Court.—Whenever, in connection with the pursuit or search of any boat, vehicle or other conveyance or otherwise, any peace officer shall find intoxicating liquor upon or in the same or which has recently been removed therefrom, which he has probable cause to believe is being or has recently been unlawfully carried, transported, kept or possessed by the owner or person in charge of, or operating such boat, vehicle or other conveyance, said officer shall, in addition to seizing the intoxicating liquor so found and arresting the person, if any, then in charge of or operating such boat, vehicle or other conveyance as heretofore provided by law, also seize such boat, vehicle or other conveyance and make return of such seizure to the circuit court of the state of Oregon for the county within which such seizure has been made, and if said seizure has been made by any other officer than a sheriff, the seized conveyance shall be delivered to the sheriff. (Laws 1923, Chap. 29.)

Section 11. Knowledge of Owner Presumed; Satisfaction of Liens.—Whenever, in proceedings under this act, intoxicating liquor is shown to have been in or upon any boat, vehicle or other conveyance or in the possession of any person in or upon the same, or is proved to have been transported or kept therein, it shall be presumed that the same was done with the knowledge and consent of the owner and the person in charge of or possession of such boat, vehicle

or other conveyance and with the knowledge and consent of any holder of any lien thereon, but such presumption shall be a disputable one. If any person proceeded against or intervening for the protection of his interest in such proceedings shall establish to the satisfaction of the court, by a preponderance of the evidence, that he is and was at the time of the commission of the act or acts for which said boat, vehicle or other conveyance is subject to forfeiture, the actual bona fide owner thereof, and that the said boat, vehicle or other conveyance had been taken and was being used by the person or persons in possession thereof at the time of the commission of said unlawful act or acts without his knowledge and consent, and that he had no notice or knowledge of such possession or of such unlawful use of the same, said boat, vehicle or other conveyance shall be ordered by the court to be returned to such owner; and if it be established to the satisfaction of the court, at the hearing, that any period of not less than one year and not more than five years, or in the county jail for a period of one year, or by fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 14. Felony to Place Intoxicating Liquor in Vehicle of Another.—Any person who shall place in any boat, vehicle or other conveyance whatsoever, other than having the same on his or her person, any intoxicating liquor, with the intent that such boat, vehicle or conveyance in which the same is placed shall be subject to forfeiture or confiscation, or that the owner of such boat, vehicle or conveyance, or the person in charge or possession thereof, shall or may be criminally prosecuted on account thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a felony, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary for a period of not less than one nor more than four years. (Laws 1923, Chap. 29.)
