ing and a machine for casting, the Ludlow continues the all-slug method of composition on up through the larger display type faces.

It is an everready miniature type foundry for producing type that is always new, all used matter being lumped to be cleaned and melted over again. The process of distribution is entirely eliminated, and with it all the non-productive time which for so long has been a bane to the printing industry. This brings the additional advantage to the advertiser of having the full benefit of the compositor's time in the arrangement of artistic display for all advertisements.

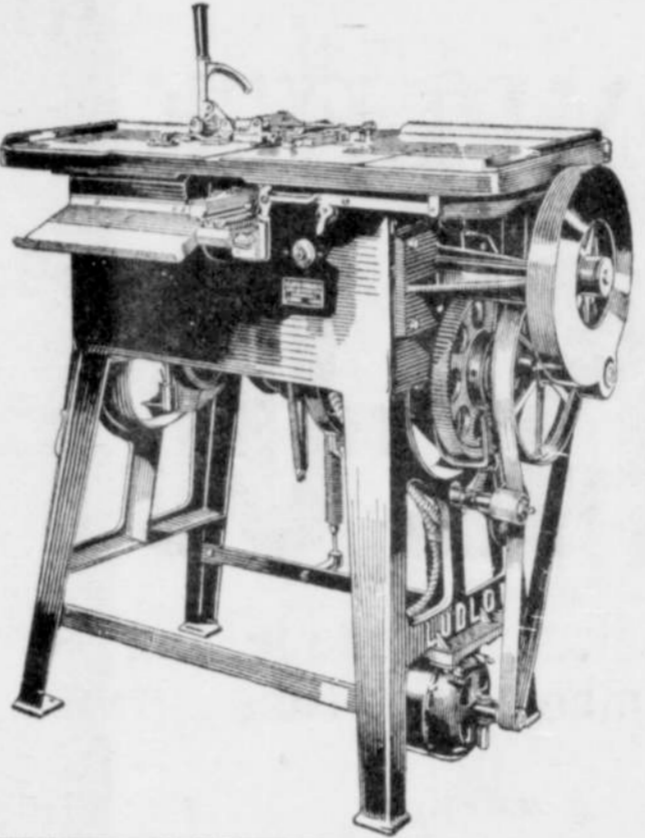
The setting of type by the Ludlow can start assembling matrices in another "stick" for his second line.

The entire operation of the Ludlow is simple and can be quickly learned by any printer, even though he has had no other experience in the handling of composing room machinery.

Still another point to the Ludlow's advantage is the silence with which it does its work. There is no grind or pound to add to the noise in the composing room, or to help wear down the machinery.

So compactly can the Ludlow equipment be arranged, it will fit into a tight corner where no other system of composition will go. In the composing room of the Headlight it is requiring but about 15 square feet of floor space.

The machine itself stands just waist-high and has a table top that measures but 39 inches long by 20 inches wide. There are no protruding



system is in reality the assembling of matrices in a "stick" or frame. After a line of matrices has been assembled, the "justification" or tightening is accomplished by means of a screw at the end of the holder and without further preparation the line is ready to be cast.

The "stick" is placed in the casting machine and a slight pressure on a lever immediately delivers the slug. The accomplished Ludlow operator can distribute his matrices in the few seconds the machine is casting and

elbows or projecting parts to hinder access to any side of the machine. The cabinet for the matrices is placed close to the machine so that the compositors in the Headlight composing room have only to make a quarter turn to reach their matrices.

The Headlight with its all-slug equipment is bringing to its readers and advertisers the same service that distinguishes newspaper like the Portland Oregonian, the Chicago Tribune, The Detroit News, or the Philadelphia Bulletin.
