mountains above Blaine 30 miles eastward from Tillamook, last Tuesday proved up on his claim of one hundred and sixty acres, taken up under the law which allows a homesteader to secure 160 acres of the old O. & C. land, upon his complying with requirements of the U. S. land office. He must also upon final proof pay the sum of \$2.50 per acre for the land thus taken. The proof made was final and the homesteader now owns the land, and will in due time receive his patent. His witnesses were John F. Slinger, and Thos. E. Bohna of the same neighborhood. Mr. Slinger since his residence in the Blaine country has officiated as witness for eight homesteaders in final proofs. It is learned that there are several thousand acres of O. & C. lands in the eastern part of this county that can be had under the special homestead act relating to this class of lands.

FILES DECLARATION

Ludvig Schmedding of Nehalem, Oregon, last Friday filed declaration to become an American citizen before County Clerk Brimhall. Mr. Schmedding was born in Norway, and wishes to become a citizen of this country. He is a Nehalem farmer.

MILL MAKES RECORD CUT

Brighton Mills Co. Brighton, made a record cut during October of 3,850,000 feet in 25 1-2 working days, averaging 257 feet per man per hour for the period. W. B. Foster, sawmill superintendent for the last five years, has resigned to commence operating for himself. Lee Sporup, formerly with St. Johns Lumber Co. and

Cobbs & Mitchell Co., succeeds him. The above mills will commence logging at its new camp at Rector about December 1. During 1924 very little spruce will be cut. The company heretofore has been known as a heavy spruce producer. A new Willamette skidder was recently purchased.—The Timberman.

ELKS MEMORIAL SERVICE

The Elks held their annual memorial services for the departed brethren of the local lodge last Sunday night at the Christian church.

There was a large attendance of Elks and their families, and other citizens. The memorial address was given by Francis V. Galloway, of the Dalles. Mr. Galloway is an orator of recognized ability, and on this occasion thoroughly upheld his reputation, as such. Many of those present re-

gard his effort here as the best of its kind ever delivered before a Tillamook audience. The address was preceded and followed by musical numbers of appropriate character. The speaker received many hearty congratulations on his fine effort at the conclusion of the services.

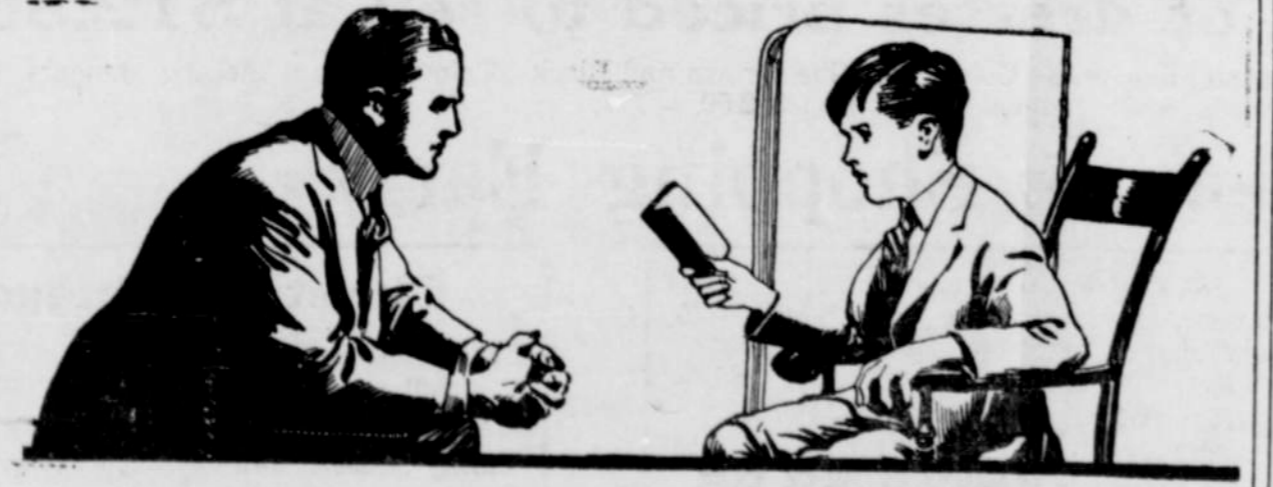
