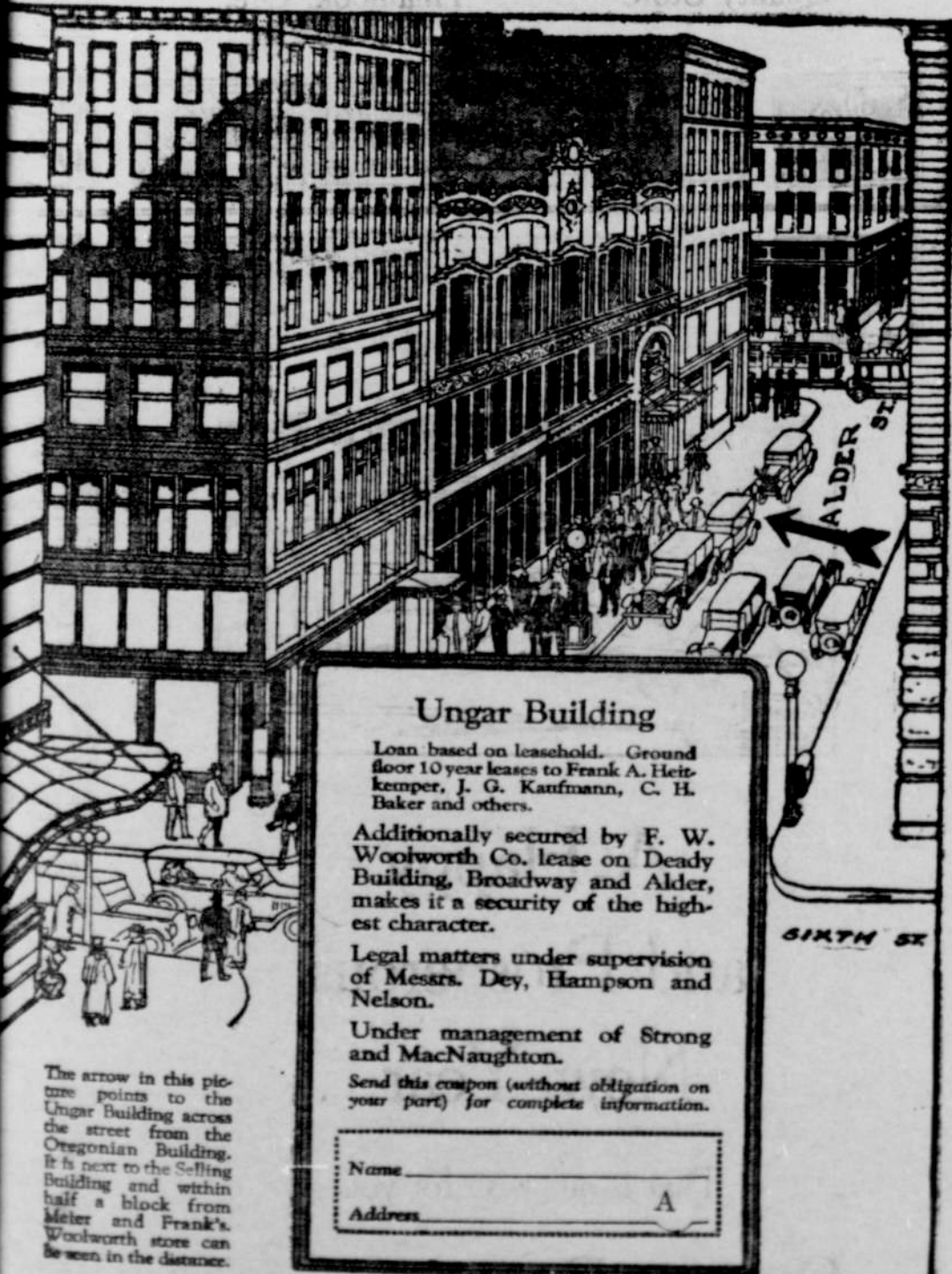

AFTERMATH OF WEYGANT ARRESTS

An account was given last week of the arrest of the two Weygant brothers and their father in this county by Sheriff Aschim and deputies. Aschim went out to McMinnville Tuesday and brought the elder Weygant back here charged with receiving stolen goods. The case will come before the Tillamook county grand jury. While out at McMinnville, Aschim talked with Lester Weygant, Lee Weygant having been taken to Multnomah county, for safe keeping. Lester stated that he was afraid his brother Lee intended to shoot the Tillamook sheriff, on the night of the arrest, and was about to tell his brother not to fire, when Lucas yelled to Aschim to "look out." He then knew that his brother would not fire, as there was a big chance that the latter would get plugged from the outside of the window. He also admitted under questioning, that Lee had robbed a store at Tigard, just previous to the Yamhill store robbery, and got a lot of groceries and bacon, etc. Aschim called up Alexander, sheriff at Hillsboro, and asked him if it was true that a store was recently robbed at Tigard, and Alexander replied that such was the case; but that he had not found the robber. He was then told that Lee Weygant was the man, but that the Yamhill sheriff was ahead of him. It is probable that Lee Weygant will be charged with the Tigard robbery later.
