ford, Oregon, and ask him a few questions in that direction. Mr. Davey's statement about the affidavit makes me think of a negro who jammed his head into a concrete wall and went away saying over and over, "There is no such thing, there is no such thing." I have never said that Mr. Olcott is a Knight of Columbus. I do not know. I do say that I have written testimony that he was seen in a Knights of Columbus hall in Portland; and that if he is not a Knight of Columbus he does a MIGHTY GOOD JOB of acting LIKE ONE. His picture in the journal of the Knights of Columbus, 'Columbia,' shortly after the last election was quite in harmony with all the rest. In the last paragraph Mr. Davey talks about truth, friendship, UNITY, and 'good will,' like he knew what they were. Mr. Davey most certainly knows that you can no more mix the Roman Catholic idea of Government and the Protestant idea, that you can mix T. N. T. and fire.
