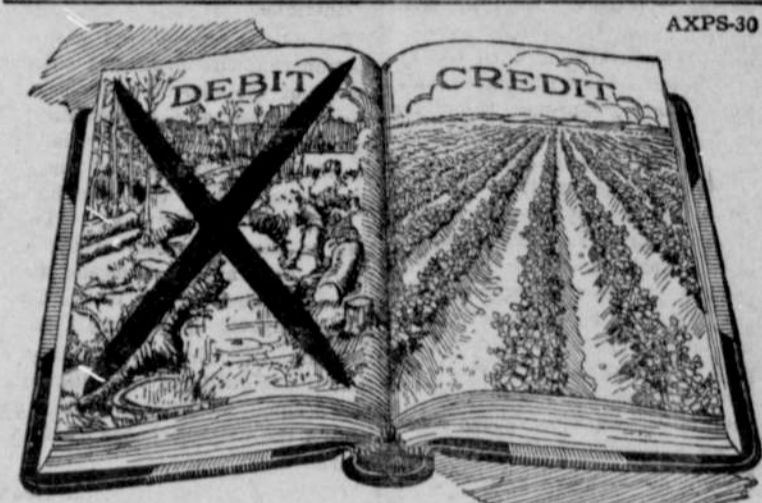
TAKES ISSUE WITH DAVEY To the Editor: The Roman Catholic church is the product, not of her lay men, but of her priesthood. The destruction of more than 60,000,000 (some say 100,000,000) men, women and children, beginning with the departure of the Roman Church from the principles of Christ, and including in modern times such men as "Black," the "Pittsburg Klansman," and shall we not say "Madero," proves beyond doubt the "tolerance?" of Roman Catholic priestcraft.
