of the Pure Dairy Products committee of the state of Washington by Carl Haberlach of the creamery association:

The Pure Dairy Products Committee, of which I am chairman, is now assembling data covering the three main points in connection with this subject.

The first point deals with the presence of vitamins in butter and their absence in vegetable oil substitutes. You are no doubt aware that this fact has been fully established and is substantiated by the statements of such men as Dr. McCollum of the Johns-Hopkins University, and other eminent authorities.

The second point which we expect to cover is the effect of the sales of these substitutes upon the economic structure of the State.

Our records show that the sales of butter substitutes annually in this State, and states now exceed four million since each pound of substitute displaces a pound of butter.

These cows added to the herds of the State of Washington investment of between twenty and would represent an additional taxable twenty-five million dollars.

This would include not only the cows but the additional acreage, the equipment on farms and in factories necessary to handle and process the output of

these additional animals. Since the average dairy herd in the State of Washington is ten cows, you will see that between two thousand and twenty-five hundred dairymen and their families would be added to our population were the sale of substitutes eliminated.

Of the four million pounds of butter substitutes sold annually in the State of Washington, less than ten per cent of this immense output is made within the State, the balance coming from outside sections—mainly from California.

Not only is the substitute itself manufactured from foreign oils, imported through ports other than those of Washington, but the cartons, boxes and other necessary appurtenances to the manufacture and sale originate outside of this state.

The home market is thus denied not only to the dairymen but to other manufacturing institutions within our state who manufacture and supply the boxes, cartons, etc., required. Washington is today exporting butter in large quantities

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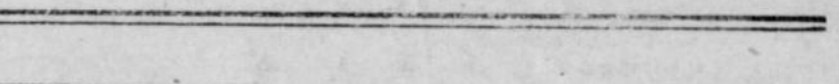
