LOCAL KIWANIS CLUB PLEASSED BY LECTURE

Charles Walker, a prominent Portland Kiwanian delivered an excellent lecture at the Kiwanis club dinner at Guild hall last Wednesday. He said that Kiwanis was an Indian name signifying water. He likened human mind to water, good and bad. The negative of good water was evil water. Pure water was one of the greatest of earthly blessings. It was mission of the Kiwanis organization to pour forth a stream of good, wholesome water, typifying as it the better impulses of humanity, and let it be a blessing to mankind. That is meant good acts, good words and courtesy to one's fellow men. The speaker likened an automobile to a man, physically, mentally, morally and morally, and proceeded to name the different parts in such machine's construction as corresponding to the thought and members of the human mind and body. The valves of the mind were also used in the illustration, and when he got part way through, the audience began to see the similarity of the construction—man and the machine—the correspondences were given word painted picture that showed the great value of comparison in comparing the things of this life. He was that everything has positive and negative aspect, and correspondence is found applying to everything in nature and in thought.

Kiwanis had a great mission in its lowest aspects touched all an effort, energy and work.
