Her parents settled on Wilson river, near Tillamook, where she lived until her marriage to Marion Shearer in 1884. After spending one year in the state of Washington, they returned to Tillamook and bought a farm near the Latimer place on Wilson river. They lived on this farm until about twenty years ago, when they moved to Garibaldi, where she lived at the time of her death, March 28th, 1924, being 60 years and 21 days old. She is survived by three children and three grandchildren, three brothers and two sisters. In her parents' home she was a devoted helper of her mother in caring for her brothers and sisters. To her own children, she was a loving and tender mother, deeming no sacrifice too great for their comfort and happiness. She gave her

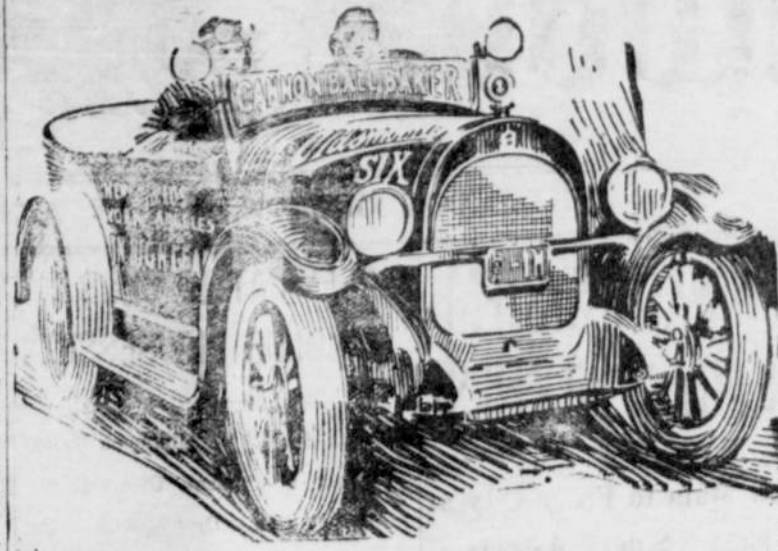

line will enter at the east boundary of the city, for certain reasons." In any event, Tillamook is to have a water system second to no town of its size in the state, say those who know. Asked as to the probable cost of the new pipe installation, superintendent Hoag, thought the cost of the four miles would amount to between \$60,000 and \$70,000. It is understood that the enlargement of the pipe line will not only materially reduce the present cost of fire insurance in the city, but will also give the fire department a greater flow of water with which to overcome fires. As the city is growing, and will continue to grow, the proposed addition to the water supply of

this city is considered a wise provision.

The source of the city's supply is from Killam creek, one of the finest pure-water mountain streams in the county, and one whose waters are not, nor can they well be contaminated, for the reason that there are no settlements above the dam or reservoir from which the water is taken.

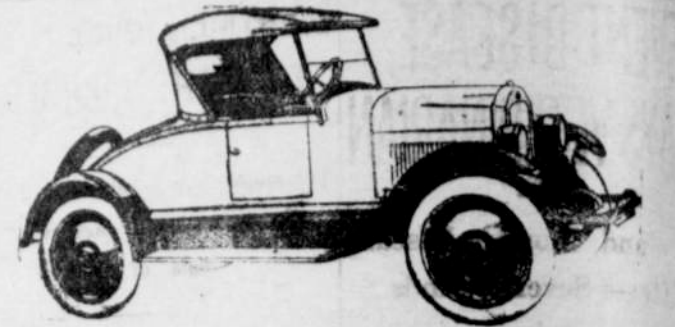

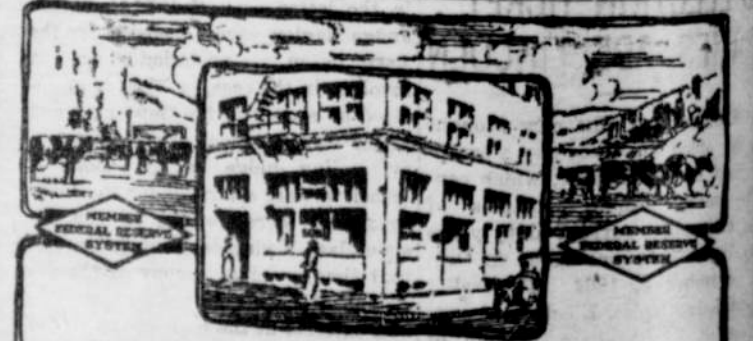
