

PROTECTION OF FOREST

(Continued from page 1) Taxation of timber is furnishing approximately 56 per cent of the total raised in the county. What would it mean to the people of Tillamook county should this source of revenue be suddenly removed? The business man with his small property value, the farmer and dairyman would be forced to carry the tax load alone, for a forest destroyed by fire has no taxable value. To contemplate such a catastrophe is appalling to say the least. Loss of such a large amount of tax money would cause a sudden halt on road work; roads now in good condition would become seas of mud in a short time; schools would in time crumble and fall from lack of funds to repair them; harbor improvements and all civic betterments would be stopped, and Tillamook county instead of continuing as a garden spot, prosperous and progressive, would become a time barren waste over a considerable portion of its area.

As a citizen of this county you naturally will be interested to know what is being done to protect a resource which has such a tremendous influence on the life of your community. Since these timber lands were acquired by the timber owners, some as far back as thirty years ago, they have been protected largely through the effort of the timbermen. At first, the patrols were organized by individual timber owners to protect their tracts and in some instances several owners would form a pool of their holdings for joint protection. This system of protection continued until 1919 when it became evident that a more compact system was needed, largely to eliminate duplication of effort in some districts and to give old burns and cut-over lands better protection. With such improvements in mind, the timber owners of Tillamook county met early in 1919 and formed the Tillamook County Fire Patrol association. A board of directors and officers were elected for the year. The members of the association meet annually at the office of the secretary in Portland to elect officers for the year. The district warden who has supervision of the field force, gets his instructions directly from the officers of the association.

The association idea is not new to Oregon, as there are now seventeen associations functioning in the state. Needless to say, the scheme has been successful from the start, as it gives the patrol of the timber and all other in the county get equal protection. In its five years of existence, the Tillamook association has expended over \$20,000 and \$40,000 annually to protect the timber from fire; a number of miles of fire trails and telephone lines have been built; cabins, towers and tool boxes have been constructed, all with the one idea in mind—to keep out the fires.

New people, outside of those directly connected with the timber industry, are what a life of care and anxiety to the timber owners lead. The investment which they have guarded and which they are during half a life time, can be wiped out in a few hours and to replace this loss will take several generations. The deplorable part of it is that from a protection standpoint, it is nearly all forest fires are caused by the carelessness of man. Statistics compiled by the state forester show that fully 95 per cent of the forest fires in the state are caused by man, and the other five per cent by lightning. In other words, we reduce our fire loss by 95 per cent if everyone is careful with fire in the timber.

It is then, is the message that the Government of the United States wishes to convey to the people. He wants you to feel that the forests are your property, to help protect and safeguard them until utilized. Every tree lost is a direct loss to you and your community. During this week of oblation try to picture in your mind a Tillamook county devoid of trees, a waste. If every rancher, tourist, camper and logging operator could see such a visualization before him about the dry, dangerous fire protection problem would be solved and newspaper accounts such as occasionally sweep the country would be things of the past.
