

**NEAR EAST WORKER  
ADOPTS SYRIAN GIRL**

The morning service at the First Christian church Sunday will be given over to a lecture by Mrs. Gannaway, who comes to speak on the Near East relief through the county.

The city of Marsovan in Turkey where Mrs. Gannaway spent 14 months has much meaning to many people in Oregon because it was there that Frances Gage of Portland met her death in the rescue of fifty of her girls from the Turks. Mrs. Gannaway was maion of the home which was established for the safety of Frances Gage's girls and others who had been unfortunate enough to fall into Turkish hands. At other times she was in charge of the receiving and distributing of all supplies for a large district, and later conducted a general retail store, bringing down the high cost of living for the villagers.

Compelled by the shifting of population due to the change in policy of the Allies and the movements of the Turks, she assisted her husband, Dr. Gannaway, in medical work in various parts of Turkey. Her last work was in Beirut, Syria, where she had charge of 1,400 girls.

Mrs. Gannaway's traveling companion is a little four-year old Armenian girl, Zadi, whom the Gannaways adopted. The child's mother during one of the deportations came to the relief station late one night and being compelled to go on the next day, was allowed as a special favor to leave the child in the hands of the Americans. The child was desperately sick and was saved from death thru the skill of Dr. Gannaway and the nursing of Mrs. Gannaway. The mother died, along with thousands of others, and the Gannaways, at-

tached to the child by their sacrifices for her, adopted her. Zadi, or Zadouhi, is described in a letter to J. J. Hand-saker, Regional Director Near East Relief, by one of his friends as a "sweet little four-year old Armenian girl of pure Armenian stock who wins her way immediately to the hearts of everyone. She is quite a pretty child with blue eyes, fair complexion and beautiful hair that hangs in long curls. She speaks English fluently and sings in a sweet voice with good carrying qualities."

**PEELING CASCARA BARK**

In his letter of January 29, to an applicant for a permit to peel cascara bark for commercial purposes from trees on vacant, unreserved public lands, the commissioner of the general land office, Washington, D. C., said:

"... you are advised that this office is without authority to grant such permit. In instances where requests similar to yours have been made for permits to utilize certain plants, grasses and roots such as 'Yucca palm', 'salt grass,' etc. for commercial purposes, the applicants have been advised that there being no rules and regulations directly applicable, it would appear to be a matter for legislative action, and in the absence of facts and figures to warrant an opinion of the urgency of such legislation, no suggestion as to procedure could be made.

"Under the circumstances I am unable to grant you a permit for any exclusive rights in the removal and use of the cascara bark desired. The department interposes no objection, however, to the free and unrestricted use of the public land by the general

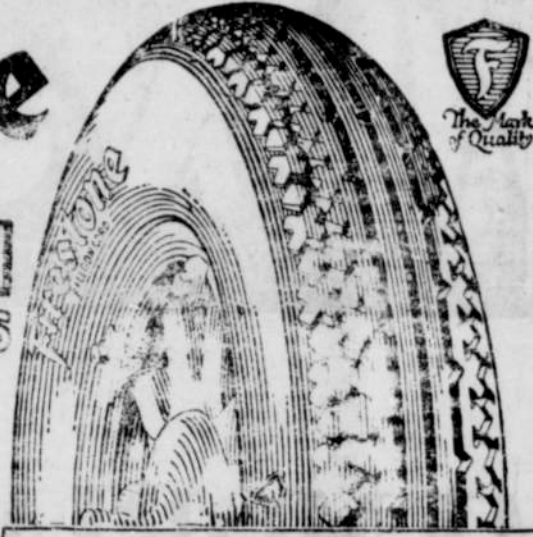
public so long as such use does not amount to an unlawful inclosure or depreciate the value of the land. In the absence of these conditions, therefore, this office will interpose no objection to the use by you of the described bark."

If the lands from which it is desired to peel cascara bark are a part of a national forest reserve in the state of Oregon, applications for permits should be addressed to the District Forester, U. S. Forest Service, room 414 post office building, Portland, Oregon.

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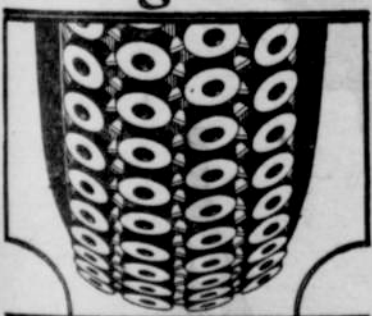
