LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL BOYS MAKE GOOD

Graduates of Tillamook School are Making their Card in the World

Verne Bain, '14, Joseph Schnal, '19, Thomas Large, '21 are making good in various activities.

Friends of Verne D. Bain, who was a member of the T. H. S. graduating class of 1914, have received announcements of his marriage to Miss Pauline McKintock of Portland. Verne joined the A. E. F. during the war and immediately after his release in 1919 took up a course of study at Willamette University in Salem. During his work there he was a leader among the students and made an enviable record in athletics, especially football. After graduation in 1923, Mr. Bain accepted a position as teacher and coach of athletics at the high school in Adna, Washington, where he has recently resigned that position to accept a better one in the school system of Springfield, Oregon.

Joseph Schnal, member of the class of 1919, who is the eldest son of Morris Schnal, one of Tillamook's leading clothiers, is working in the haberdashery shop of W. T. Gardner company, San Francisco. He has been very successfully handling the window displays for this company and in a recent clothiers' magazine appears a photographic reproduction of one of his window displays in the Gardner firm's store.

Thomas Large, of the class of 1921 has been giving a good account of himself at Pacific University, Forest Grove, Oregon, since last fall, when he took up a course of study at that place. During the past track and field season he has broken the college's records in the shot-put, discus throw, and equalled the record in the hundred yard dash. He was also a member of the University's mile relay team, and was high-point man in all the meets in which Pacific entered this spring. Besides this wonderful record in athletics, Tom also took an active part in the Freshman class play, and was awarded the Gamma Sigma Forensic Cup which is given by that fraternity to its member making the most progress during the year in debate and oratory.

NORTHWEST WHEAT CROP IS SHORT

The wheat crop of the northwest is estimated to be only about two thirds of that of last year. Oregon is estimated to be producing 16,500,000 bushel as against 28,000,000 bushel last year. Washington is producing about 30,000,000 bushel as against 41,750,000 for last year. The entire wheat production of the country is estimated at a little less than 700,000,000 bushel, about 93,000,000 bushel less than last year's output. Countries that export wheat are about 168,000,000 bushels short of the annual average demand of the countries that import the grain. This situation has already hoisted the price from 1 to 5 cents per bushel.

REPUBLIC CONVENTION AT CLEVELAND IS ENTHUSIASTIC

After considerable debate over several names for a running mate for Mr. Coolidge, the delegates have shown a decided preference for senator Borah of Idaho. Enthusiasm was keen in support of Coolidge for the presidential nomination. The platform adopted a world court plan drafted by the president. An anti-Klan plank was approved. The insertion of a farm-aid plank was deemed necessary to insure the vote of the northwest in the November elections. The LaFollette planks were rejected and the insurgent delegates showed little enthusiasm.

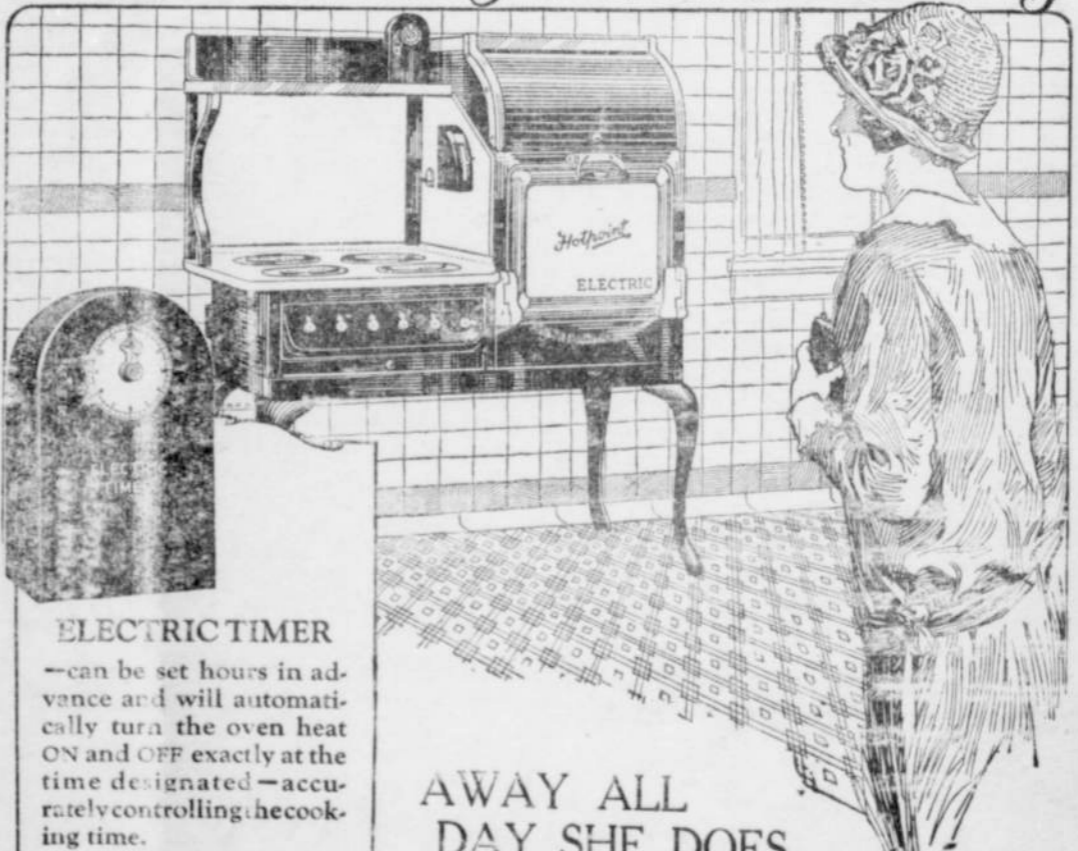
