...would invite war. This is a free country and everyone entitled to his opinion. The pacifists and the unpreparedness people are entitled to their opinion and are entitled to tell the world what it is.

...American Legion is entitled to its opinion. On the preparedness question it has formed its opinion long ago. It helped draft the law under which this defense test will be held.

...Quinn, the National Commander, has the view that this rather makes a duty incumbent upon the Legion to help make this test a success, and help make this test a success, and help make this test a success.

...harder others may work to defeat the ends of the test the harder the Legion should work to put that across. A farmer isn't showing particularly vicious traits of character when he lets it be known that he keeps a watchdog in his melon patch. That doesn't encourage theft.

...more than for Uncle Sam to let the world know he keeps a watchdog on his porch. This is the Legion's prerogative.

...of course, prepared or unprepared, the country always fights when there is no other way out, and most ordinary pacifists do their share with their hands.

...the trouble with going in unprepared is that it costs many lives and too much money. The fact that we have always supported the war profiteer in the rearmament style to which he has become accustomed, and always have been prodigal with the lives of our young men, is, when you get right down to it, a pretty weak argument in favor of continuing that way of doing things.

...the defense test which will be conducted on September 12th gets the question of war and preparedness down to bedrock. What do men fight for, anyway? What do they defend their homes for. As the late Colonel Roosevelt inquired, "Who ever heard of a man fighting a boarding house?"

...America your home or your boarding house? If it is your home, you should keep that engagement with Captain X. The date is Friday, September 12th.

...being a Legionnaire, you may not get on the ground beforehand to help the Captain give his party. More than likely he's a buddy.

...FARM REMINDERS

...adding organic material to worn garden soils increases their water capacity and improves their tilth. The best material was either barnyard manure or green manure in tests made by the experiment station. These materials also added beneficial bacteria.

...wheat and oats were not so satisfactory for fattening pigs on grain as Western Oregon as alfalfa, clover, and winter wheat in tests conducted by the experiment station animal husbandry department. They did stand the grazing so well nor do they grow after being eaten off.

...change from corn silage to oats or vetch silage was made for the A. C. dairy herd in feeding tests without loss of appetite or other apparent ill effects. In abrupt changes from either of these silages to sun-dried silage the cows refused to accept in one case.

...when bees persist in attempts to swarm and moderate increase is not desirable, artificial swarming may be resorted to. This is especially advisable when preparation for swarming has gone too far to be prevented. The methods for artificial swarming explained in the O. A. C. extension service bulletin, "Beekeeping in Oregon," by H. A. Scullen.

...the death of red raspberries, blackberries, and loganberries in Oregon may first appear in short crops of fruit and reduced growth of plants. To protect sound hills the removal of all hills that show indications of the trouble is recommended. The experiment station plant pathologist.
