After the cable has cooled, it is given a final and very thorough electrical test. It is very essential that every cable contain at least as many perfect pairs of wires as are called for in the order, and for this reason a few extra pairs are usually velop during the manufacturing oper-

If the cable tests are satisfactory, the sheath is sealed up at the ends to prevent possible entrance of moisture, the reel is boarded up and the finished product is ready for ship-
