

NEW OLDSMOBILE SIX

A 5-passenger coach, combining comfort and style with moderate price, has been added to the Oldsmobile Motor Works, Lansing, Michigan. The coach was designed by the Fisher Corporation and is the first of its type of closed body to be manufactured by that well known manufacturer. While the new model has been designed as a touring car, it is virtually a two-door sedan, having the same appearance and refinements included in all closed models of the Oldsmobile line. It is being introduced to meet the growing demand for closed cars, which now form more than 70 per cent of the entire production of the Oldsmobile factory. The coach is made of metal panels on a floor to roof and is finished in the rich blue Duco which was adopted as standard for Oldsmobiles several years ago. The body has gracefully curved curves at the back and is the same length as the standard sedan. The roof is covered with heavy waterproof grained fabricoid, which same material is used to cover the metal sun visor. The doors are exceptionally wide, being 33 inches, and allow easy entrance and exit to and from both front and rear seats. Heavy plate glass is used for the windows, those on the doors and sides of the coach being 30 by 17 inches. The door windows lower flush with the bottom of the frame, while those in the side of the body lower more than half an inch, giving open car coolness and protection during the hot weather season. All windows are operated by quick action turn lifters. The coach is equipped with the Fisher one piece, ventilating, vision windshield, which was recently introduced by the body building company.

ANY STEPS INVOLVED IN MANUFACTURE OF CABLE

The sight of a Western Electric reel in the street of our cities is familiar one. All the cable used in the Bell system is manufactured by the Western Electric company at its Hawthorne plant in Chicago, and great has been the demand for telephone cable that another huge plant is being constructed at Kearny, New Jersey, which, when completed, will greatly increase the cable output of the company. The use of telephone cable dates back to the early history of the telephone business. As early as 1882 experiments were made in putting telephone wires in underground conduits, and since that time a great deal of study and experimentation has been devoted to cable transmission with the result that today more than 88 per cent of the telephone lines in the Bell system is in cable, and three-quarters of which is underground. First it was thought that the placement of the telephone business would be seriously handicapped by the fact that transmission in the open was much more difficult than in wire circuits, the transmission losses in a telephone circuit in a one mile long being as great as those in about 30 miles of open wire. In this comparison small diameter cable conductors are compared with large gauge open wire conductors. One by one the obstacles to underground transmission were removed, notable advances in the art of loading and balancing underground circuits and great improvements in intermediate apparatus were made, and in 1913 the longest underground cable system in the world was completed between Washington, D. C., and Boston, covering a distance of about 450 miles. Comparatively recent developments in cable transmission have greatly improved the use of cables and an all-cable line between New York and Boston is approaching completion. The process of manufacturing the telephone cable, now in general use, is extremely interesting. The material of which cable is manufactured—copper wire, paper, antimony and lead. These come to the Hawthorne works by the carload, the wire being cut to length and the antimony and lead known as "pigs." The wire has been drawn to the proper size and thoroughly annealed so that it is soft and flexible. The paper is in thickness from two and one-half-thousandths to fourteen-thousandths of an inch. It is prepared for the particular purpose for which the composition is such as to insure a strong and durable sheath metals, which are of high degree of purity, come direct from the smelter.
