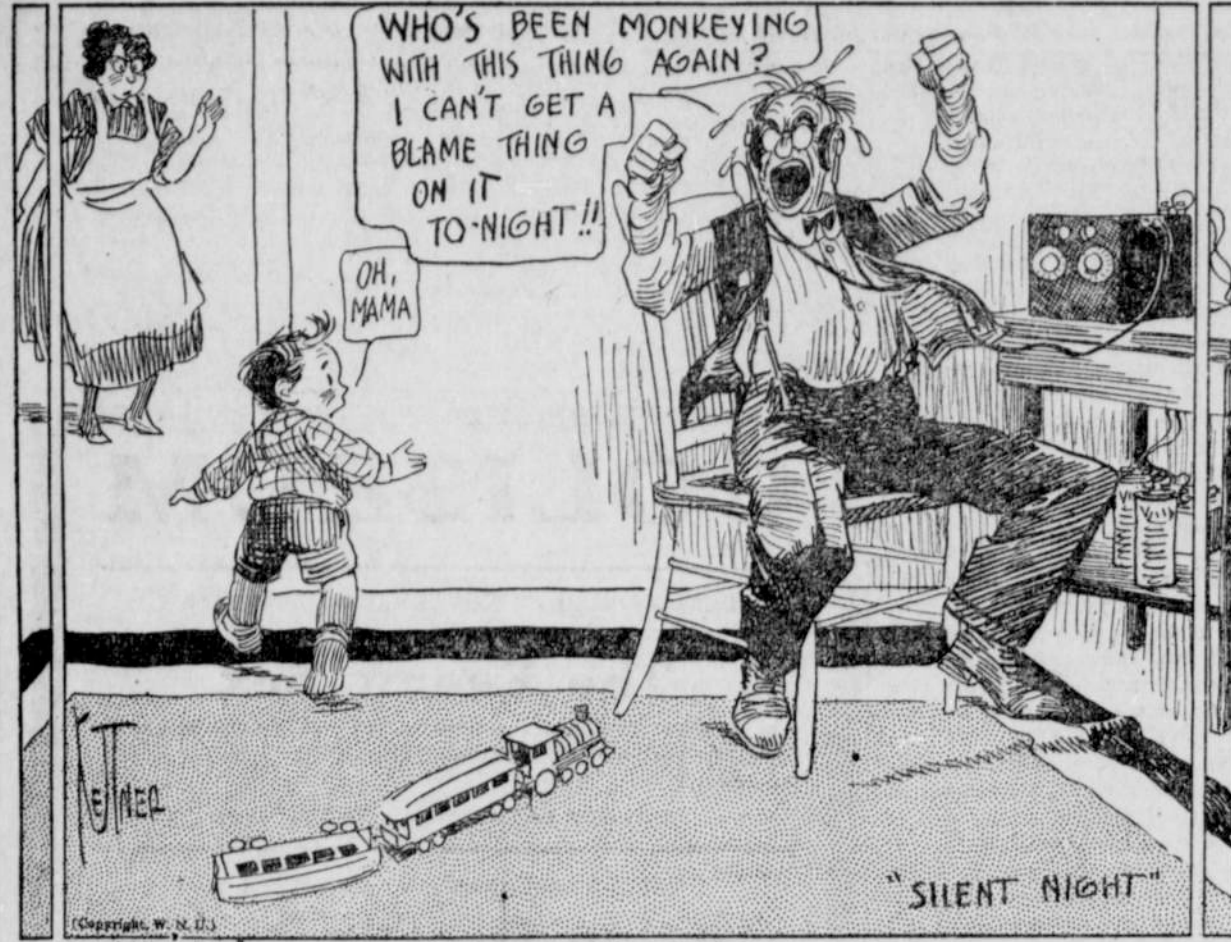


Ether Waves
