NEW RAILROAD FOR TILLAMOOK.

On Thursday evening C. E. Lytle of Hillsboro met with the Tillamook Commercial Club and asked the citizens there assembled as to how they would like a new railroad. Of course all expressed themselves as being desirous of seeing an added institution to our county.

Mr. Lytle then went on to explain that he represented a company that was going to build a road from the Willamette valley through the Grande Ronde or Sheridan pass of the Coast Range south to Yaquina Bay and north to Tillamook City taking in the south end of the county.

Work on the new road will begin in the near future, said Mr. Lytle, from three points, viz: Tillamook City, Yaquina Bay and some point in the Willamette Valley.

Mr. Lytle stated that the survey for the new line between Tillamook City and Portland was only five miles longer than the distance between these two cities over the P. R. & N. and the new road would have not more than a one per cent grade at any point, while the P. R. & N. has as high as a three per cent grade. The new road will not have more than five miles of a one per cent grade and it is estimated that an engine can haul five times as much freight out over the new road as can be hauled over the P. R. & N.

All Mr. Lytle asked for at this time was the good will and sanction of the project by the Commercial Club which was readily granted in the form of a resolution.

The new road will be a great benefit to Tillamook City and is but one of the immediate results of the completion of the plans and arrangements for our harbor improvements.

MILL PROPERTY CHANGES HANDS.

The Tillamook Lumber and Manufacturing Co. was sold yesterday to A. F. Coats of Seattle, who has associated with him O. A. and C. H. Schultz late of Aberdeen, Wash., and H. A. Franklin, formerly of this city.

O. A. Schultz will be general manager and have charge of the company. Mr. Schultz has taken active part in saw milling at Grays Harbor for the past fifteen years. He plans on starting the mill next Monday and run it continuously until the first of the year when it will be shut down for extensive repairs and improvements.

Mr. Schultz states that he will begin to stock up and carry several million feet of dry stock so as to take care of the local trade at all times.

The new firm will be called the A. F. Coats Lumber Company, and its headquarters will be at Tillamook City.

We are sure that the people of Tillamook City and county will heartily welcome the members of the new firm and that everything will be done to give them encouragement and assistance whenever it is needed. We should remember the slogan "Patronize Home Industry."
