Rules Governing Exhibits

1. Every boy and girl in Tillamook County under 21 years of age is eligible to enter these contests. The contest will be divided into two classes, Class A will include all 12 years of age and over; Class B will include all under 12 years of age. The prizes will be offered on the basis of these qualifications. There must be a statement accompanying each exhibit signed by the parents or guardian of each child certifying that the exhibit entered was prepared by the exhibitor; the statement should give age of exhibitor also.

2. Each child must do all the work in preparing his or her exhibit. In gardening the ground may be plowed by some one else if desired.

3. No pupil will make more than one entry for each prize, but they may enter as many competitions as they desire, in their class.

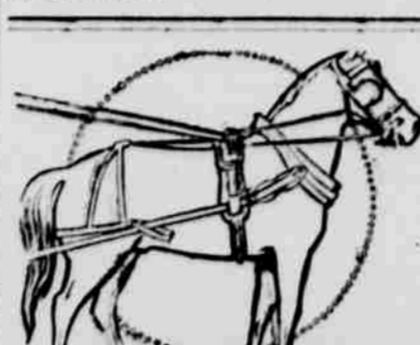
4. Entries for all living things will be received up to 12 o'clock noon, Sept. 3. Other entries will close at 9 o'clock P. M., Sept. 2.
