

The grand lodge of the Knights of Pythias of Oregon will hold its thirtysecond annual session in Portland beginning today. It is said this will be the most important session ever held by the grand lodge in this state.

The wedding was held at the home of the bride and the services were conducted by Rev. D. - L. Shrode. After the services a light luncheon was served.


