**BACK TO THE LAND; MANY MEMBERS OF ORGANIZED LABOR JOIN THE MOVEMENT**

**RAILROAD COMMISSION TO DECIDE ON DEPOT SITE AT WHEELER**

Salem, Ore., Nov. 22.—The railroad commission will be at Wheeler on December 3 to hold a formal hearing on the question of a depot site in that town. The Pacific Railway & Navigation Company has stated that it is prepared to spend \$7,000 for a depot at that point, but a controversy is on as to the proper site.

The company desires to locate the building at the property of the Wheeler Lumber Company, having purchased right of way and grounds, it appears, with an understanding that the station would be placed at that point. Some of the citizens have other views. These conflicting views will be heard by the commission, and the proposed sites will be looked over. The hour fixed for the hearing is 3 o'clock in the afternoon.
