During the past week Tillamook county has been swept by a very severe rain and wind storm. R. & N. Railway has been put out of commission and it is said that it will take at least three weeks to make repairs necessary for the handling of traffic. There are numerous slides between this point and Wheeler and it is stated that at some points the track is seriously undermined by the high water. Some bridges are also reported out up in the mountains. At the Bat-

The East Beaver bridge on the main road south has been washed out and it is reported that the Three Rivers bridge at Hebo has been washed away, but this is only a rumor.
