CLOVERDALE NEWS
RATTLED THE BANDIT.
 Curious Experience With a Band of Mexican Cutthroats.
 Everybody in Mexico goes about armed. Even the passenger trains on most of the railroads are guarded by detachments of soldiers who ride in special cars, while on every station platform are seen rural guards armed with carbines ready for an emergency. For strangers have to adapt themselves to the custom of going about armed or else make themselves unfavorably conspicuous in the eyes of the natives. It was a novel experience, however, to see railroad surveyors, when occupied with their peaceful work, armed to the teeth with knives and revolvers. As a matter of fact, arms were rarely required in Mexico as a means of defense. As everywhere else, it is well to remember, however, to keep cool and forget that you are armed in case of a quarrel.
 In this connection the principal local engineer of the road had an experience at which he displayed some nerve. He had to make a reconnaissance of a mountain range called the Sierra Gorda, said to be infested with cutthroats. He was warned to let the district alone, but duty prevailed, and he went. When reaching a rancho near the summit at sundown he and his attendant were met by four men whose law breaking propensities required no further introduction than their faces. They took hold of the party's horses, told the engineer and his attendant to dismount and made no effort to conceal the fact that they were there for business.
 The engineer complied smilingly, and going up to the leader, mystified that individual by asking him to step aside "I am told that it is unsafe to travel in these mountains," he whispered. "Will you not therefore oblige me by taking care of my property and allow me to remain under your roof until morning." With that he handed over his watch, money and other things, and the astonished thief, who was probably for the first time in his life treated to the novelty of being trusted, not only let the engineer have the best in his house, but handed him back his property in the morning and furnished him with two cutthroats to serve as an escort during the rest of his journey.—Max T. Respected Citizen Passes Away.
 Chas. Burke, well known in Tillamook county, and one of its successful ranchers, died at his home two miles northwest of Cloverdale, Tuesday, January 6. Mr. Burke was taken ill about ten days previous to his death and every effort possible by the best medical aid was made to bring back the patient to his possession of health, without avail.
 Mr. Burke was born in Des Moines, Iowa, in April of 1856, was married May 1, 1881, to this union four children were born, three of whom survive him, Leonard, Paul and Mrs. Fay Hock, of Everett, Wash., as also does his wife whose constant care during his short illness helped to sweeten his last days.
 Mr. Burke with his family moved to Tillamook County from North Dakota 20 years ago and has since been a resident of the county.
 He became affiliated with the church when he was a young man 20 years of age and died a faithful believer. The funeral service was held at the home Wednesday, January 7, interment in the Glat cemetery, Rev. Clark officiating.

MOSBY FLED WITH HIS MEN.
 An Attack That Wholly Demoralized the Partisan Rangers.
 Colonel John S. Mosby, commander of the Partisan rangers, who gave such a dashy service in the southern states, told of an amusing incident in which he figured.
 In the summer of 1864 when General Phil Sheridan was in the valley of the Shenandoah he found himself much harassed by Mosby, who was continually cutting off his supply trains. An army cannot fight on an empty stomach, and Mosby knew it. One bright morning Mosby heard that a long supply train was winding its way down the valley. By noon the rangers in their gray uniforms were gathered at the forks of the valley pike, watching for the head of the wagon train to appear.
 Presently a cloud of dust was seen rising far up the road, and as the wind blew it aside the Confederates caught sight of a line of men in blue escorting a caravan of lumbering wagons drawn by mules. Instantly Mosby gave the order to run a little howitzer up on the side of a hill and unlimber it. As soon as the gun had opened fire the rest of the men were to make a cavalry charge and throw the train into confusion.
 The rangers jerked the gun into position and began to swab it out. Suddenly the man with the swab gave a shrill yell, seized the seat of his pantaloons and fled down the hill and out into the road. Almost in the same moment the other man at the gun abandoned it. He seemed to be fighting at the air as he disappeared over a stone wall.
 The sutler's wagons were creeping nearer, and Mosby did not know what to think of such extraordinary conduct. He ordered four more men to the gun, but hardly had they reached it when they saw the yell, began to beat the air wildly with their hats and took to flight.
 Ignoring his horse over the stone wall, Mosby rode toward the gun, but his stay was short. The howitzer stood just over a hornet's nest, and those busy insects were resenting the intrusion. They had repelled the invaders on foot, and now they swarmed on Mosby's horse till the maddened animal tore off down the pike on a run. Then they turned their attention to the rest of the troop.
 Their attack was so vicious that the rangers gave up any idea of standing by the gun. They scattered far and wide, and it was an hour before they returned. When they did the wagon train had safely vanished in the distance. So the hornets saved the day for Sheridan.—Youth's Companion.

Capturing Zanzibar.
