Editor of the Herald:

31, 1914, until said tributary of Tillamook Bay, known as Tillamook River, and its tributaries, above a point 100 feet below the lowermost portion of the mouth of Trask River, is or are opened again to salmon fishing herein prohibited, as provided for under Section 5316 of Lord's Oregon Laws; and it is unlawful to fish for, or to catch any salmon fish by hook and line, commonly called angling, in any of said waters during said periods of time above specified.

Any and all persons whomsoever having in violation of this act will be prosecuted as by law provided.

THE INCOME TAX.

Portland, Ore., Jan 2, 1914.
County Treasurer, Tillamook County, Oregon.

DEAR SIR, Enclosed I am sending you a few blanks relative to the income tax. Please give matter as such publicity as you can, through the press and otherwise, that any person, firm or corporation desiring income tax blanks can procure the same by applying to this office.

The law as to failing to make returns is as follows:

"This return must be filed on or before the 1st day of March, preceding the close of the calendar year for which return is made."

"The penalty for failure to file the return within the time specified by law is \$20 to \$1000. In case refusal or neglect to render the return within the required time, except in case of sickness or absence 50 per cent shall be added amount of tax assessed. In case false or fraudulent return, 100 per cent shall be added to such amount, and any person required by law to make, render, sign or verify a return who makes any false, fraudulent return or statement with intent to defeat or evade the payment required by this section to be made shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be fined not exceeding \$3000, or be imprisoned not exceeding one year, or both, at the discretion of the court, with costs of prosecution."
