COMMUNICATION. It may delight Bro. Baker of the Headlight to poke fun at a poor farmer like me, but a half column statement in a recent issue of that sheet, regarding my complaint against the injustice of an increased tax assessment of \$1200 on my farm by County Assessor Chas. Johnson without any notice, is full of false statements and poor logic. He says I had been offered \$10,000 for my place and I refused it. Just let the learned or unlearned editor of the Headlight or County Assessor Chas. Johnson, bring some sucker around with something that looks like \$10,000, and we will shake hands and be friends for evermore. I challenge Bro. Johnson to assess my land at \$10,000 as the Headlight suggests. He will have to show me, and I'm not from Missouri either. I paid \$3000 for my farm a few years ago, and the owner of the property had been searching for a purchaser a long time. Over 100 acres of the 152 acres I possess is worthless and I never received a cent of revenue from it. The timber has been logged off years ago and as far as my asking \$300 per acre for 10 acres of bottom land, why it would take all the good land I own to fulfill a contract of that kind. I wonder if the county assessor has ever thought of what the land has cost me in the shape of labor and sacrifice. If the farmer who by his own sweat and muscle clears a few acres of bottom land and then is assessed \$1250 extra for his labor, has no rights on this earth, as the Headlight suggests, then the sooner the farmers get together for a united effort, the better. For the benefit of the great but unconscious editor of the Tillamook Headlight, I beg to state that value is essentially an ethical term, and we may have as many different theories of value as there are different views of business ethics. But these views fall under two main heads: The commercial or competitive theory which bases value upon what the buyer is willing and able to offer for an article; and the socialistic theory which bases it upon what the article has cost the seller in the way of toil and sacrifice.
