A. S. Bennett, of The Dalles, one of the Democratic candidates for the office of Governor at the May primaries, was in the city this week getting acquainted with our people. Mr. Bennett was at one time Circuit Judge. He has been in the state 48 years, having crossed the plains when a small boy in the year 1865. He was formerly a resident of Yamhill County. He is considered one of the best lawyers in the state. He defended Senator Mitchell and Congressman Williams in the celebrated land fraud cases and was employed by the state grange in defending the Initiative and Referendum in the suit brought by the Pacific Telegraph Co. This case went to the highest tribunal in the land with the result that the Initiative and Referendum laws were declared constitutional.

Died, at North Yakima, Wash., on Sunday, Joseph Severance, brother of Attorney A. W. Severance and brother of Frank Severance, deceased was born at Carroll, Mo., in 1852, and at the age of 25 went to St. Paul, and shortly after to Pierce County, Wis. He was married to Lydia Weston and 12 children were born to the union, only four of whom survive. He enlisted in the 12th Wisconsin in 1863 and served under Sherman. He came to Tillamook 18 years ago and moved to North Yakima three years after, where he has resided since. His four children A. W. and Edward Severance and Mrs. Meyer and Ella Severance were with him when he died, all of whom reside in North Yakima.
