What is the cause of the epidemic of influenza in Tillamook? The National Board of Health has issued the following report:

We are now in the midst of an epidemic of influenza, which is spreading rapidly throughout the country. It is a disease which is highly contagious and is characterized by a sudden onset of fever, headache, sore throat, and cough. It is often accompanied by a runny nose and a general feeling of malaise.

The cause of this epidemic is not yet known, but it is believed to be due to a virus which is highly contagious and is spread by direct contact with the patient or by droplets of saliva or mucus which are expelled during a cough or sneeze.

In the last issue of the *Headlight* Bro. Baker has a severe spell, because of the fact that "Kangaroo" butter and cheese, products of Australia and New Zealand, are being shipped from China to this country. No doubt the next serious "contamination" to attack the *Headlight* man will be the shipment of Dutch cheese from Japan and the transportation of Russian leather from South America.

The shipment of foreign butter into this country has had some effect upon the butter market but not the effect that was expected. The lowering of the price of butter has been brought about more through local conditions than by foreign competition.

In regard to the cheese market, that remains firm, the present duty of 20 per cent ad valorem, apparently, being sufficient to secure against disastrous foreign competition. The much heralded invasion of "Kangaroo" cheese, which has been the wail and cry of local standard-bearers has not materialized. Which fact has no doubt already occasioned the calamity howler much sorrow.

There is a very firm market for cheese throughout the country. Only scant supplies are being offered by Tillamook and this is being held at full prices with shippers unable to fill the trade. Eastern stock costs more to land here than home made and it is not as extensively sought.

### STATE INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENT COMPENSATION ACT

"The twenty-seventh legislative assembly of the state of Oregon enacted chapter 112, laws of 1913, known as Workmen's Compensation Act, and created a Commission of three members to have charge of the administration of the law.

"The primary purpose of the Act is to take from the courts the settlement of all disputes arising from injury to and death of workmen, by providing a prompt, certain and practically automatic system of compensation and relieving the employer of the burden of carrying liability insurance and defending frequent suits for damages.

"The law is optional but certain occupations automatically come under the Act unless written rejection of the terms of the law is filed. Any employer who has rejected the Act may recall such rejection before June or thereafter upon 30 days notice to the Commission.

"Contributions are due and benefits payable under the law beginning July 1, 1914. The contribution of the employer and employee for the month of July must be paid to the Commission on or before August 15th and monthly thereafter on or before the 15th of the month following that for which contribution is made.

"The employer in class A is required to contribute during the first year 3 per cent of his pay roll each month and to deduct from the wages of each of his workmen subject to the Act, one-half of 1 per cent, with a minimum of 25 cents, for each workman and forward same to the Commission with his contribution.

"The Class B employer pays into the fund monthly during the first year 14 per cent of his pay roll and is required to transmit therewith one-fourth of 1 per cent on account of the wages of each workman subject to the Act with a minimum of 25 cents for each of such workmen.

"Any employer in either class who operates for 12 months without accident in his plant and has made payments to the Commission as per the above schedule, will not be required to pay more into the fund either for himself or his workmen until accidents occur in his plant, the protection of the Act to continue the same as before; this provision being subject to an emergency clause to care for a possible series of serious accidents.

"No employer may ever be called upon to pay in excess of 3 per cent of his pay roll for two successive years on account of any one accident and then never in a lump sum but simply by paying into the fund for two years at the rate provided for the class in which his industry is placed.

"The Act provides for the payment out of the Industrial Accident Fund of hospital and medical treatment not exceeding \$250 in any one case, expenses of burial not to exceed \$100 in any one

case and monthly compensation to injured workmen or their dependents, ranging from \$5 to \$75 per month and continuing from one day to 180, depending on the workman's injury, the size of his family, the amount of wages at time of injury and other conditions.

"In order to secure compensation, the workman must file with the Commission within one year, his application for same.
