A NEW RECORD HOLSTEIN COW

From Board of Dairymen:
I am advised by preliminary reports that the Holstein-Friesian cow, Glen Canary DeKal No. 13179, has broken the record for fat production in the senior three-year class of both the 7-day and 30-day divisions, by producing in seven consecutive days 27,675 lbs. fat from 514.5 lbs. milk, and in thirty consecutive days 111,855 lbs. fat from 2,402 lbs. milk. She freshened on January 1st, 1914, at the age of 3 years, 11 months, 3 days. Her sire is Sir Johanna Canary DeKal No. 44034; her dam is Glenn DeKal Arts 3d No. 68827. She was bred by Mr. G. L. Miller, Northfield, Minn.; and she is now owned by Mr. E. C. Schroeder, Moorhead, Minn. In the 7-day division she displaces Johanna Korndyke Anggie No. 139481, whose record for seven days is 27,451 lbs. fat from 588.4 lbs. milk, and in the 30-day division she displaces Mayflower Lillip Pauline 2d No. 134003, whose record for thirty days is 102,503 lbs. fat from 2,153.0 lbs. milk.

WATER FRONT NEWS

The schooner Patsy arrived at Tillamook on Wednesday with a large load of merchandise, and left for Portland this morning. The Sue H. Elmore is expected here the latter part of next week. She is now at Portland being rebuilt throughout. Her rate of speed will be increased one mile per hour, and she will be able to carry 35 more tons of freight than formerly. The Elmore will make a five days schedule between here and Portland this summer. The Gerald C. is expected here from Portland on Saturday.

COMMUNICATION

Editor Herald:
The farmers of the Miami want a county road. At present it is unsafe and for hours blocked by the building and blasting operations of the new construction company that have contracted to get out the rock for the Tillamook jetty. I realize that the construction camp that has been located on the Miami and the operations of the contractors who are to get out the rock for the new jetty, are employed at a work which is of great importance to the section of Oregon and I would be the last to place a straw in their way, but we who own farms and make our living on the Miami demand a county road or an easement to travel to town. Last Wednesday the road was blocked by big trees and blasting operations, and I am informed this is to continue. There is only one road to travel on and we are against it. One of the jokes of the whole affair is that there is no one living on that part of the road that these rock contracting parties wish to use, they having bought out the only resident and on the east side of the Miami there are seven families who are dependent on the only road in this section. Why not build the two miles of road on the east side of the Miami and give us farmers an easement to market. Let the contractors who are about to build a great public service have the road that they require, but give us a road on the east side of the Miami. For years the farmers has been looked upon as an easy mark and anything would go with him, but there is a limit to all things. It is now up to the County Commissioner from this district to make good by building this public necessity, a road on the east side of the Miami.
