A Chester county (Pa.) quartz concern has instituted a unique plan of offering to increase by ten per cent the pay of every employe who totally abstains from intoxicating liquors. Thus we have another argument against the whisky business, which should be far reaching. The above argument will appeal to that class who are prone to measure things by dollars and cents. When an employer offers a man a ten per cent increase in his wages if he will not use intoxicating liquors, it means that actual facts and conclusive data have been considered and are back of the decision. The above is one of the Temperance arguments in which money talks, and as this is an age of commercialism the financial phase of the whisky problem will in the last analysis be the power which will overturn the whisky business.

The offer of an increase of ten per cent in wage ought to awaken many a man to the fact that if total abstinence is worth that much to an employer from eight to ten hours of the day, it ought to be worth just as much to the employe during the hours in which he is not working, by enabling him to put his spare time to better advantage and get more satisfactory enjoyment out of life in a general way.

The political woods are full of candidates who are after the governorship of this state. There are many good men after the high position on both the Democrat and Republican side of the fence. In considering the matter from a personal standpoint we would like to see some good Democrat land the job. However, if we are to have a Republican governor our preference is Dr. James Withycombe, who for the past twenty years has been director of the Oregon Agricultural College. In our opinion there is not another man in Oregon who is as well equipped to look after the agricultural interests of Oregon as is Dr. Withycombe. His twenty years of experience at the Oregon Agricultural College has given him a wonderful insight into the agricultural needs of Oregon. Dr. Withycombe is not only a man of considerable ability, but he is a man who stands for better things all along the line. If we are to have a Republican Governor let it be Dr. Withycombe.

## UNIVERSAL 8-HOUR LAW

The following drastic 8-hour law will be submitted to the people of state for passage in November:

Article XV, Section 9, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon shall be read as follows:

Be it enacted by the people of the state of Oregon:

That, it shall constitute a criminal offense, punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both, for any person, firm, company or corporation, or his, her or their foreman, overseer, superintendent, manager or any other agent, TO EMPLOY, in the State of Oregon, any man, woman, boy or girl, for more than eight hours in any one calendar day; or more than forty-eight hours in any one calendar week. By this law, employment for eight hours in any calendar day shall be confined to nine consecutive hours, allowing one hour for eating and rest. The period of nine consecutive hours with eight hours for work therein, and one hour for eating and rest, shall by the provisions of this law, be identical for each, any, and every calendar day of each, any, and every calendar week.

This law, and the provisions thereof shall apply, with equal force, to each, any and every person, man, woman, boy or girl, EMPLOYED for pay, remuneration, profit, or compensation of any kind whatsoever; in, on, around, or about each, and every cafe, club, hotel, restaurant, farm, laundry, hospital, cannery or packing plant, factory, lumber yard, logging camp, sawmill, oil, steam, or electric railway or railroad, to express, teaming and draying concerns, to telegraph, telephone, engineering, mechanical, mercantile, mining, foundry, iron and machine work, to laborers, domestics, artisans, mechanics and tradesmen in the building trades, to office, store, barber shop, garage, workshop, ship, wharf, warehouse and waterfront work, any and everywhere in the state of Oregon. By this law neither man-

ual labor, trades, nor the professions shall be exempted, but every form of labor, skilled and unskilled, as well as every trade and profession, and persons working therein or thereat, shall be included in, by and under this law, within the State of Oregon.

Further, be it enacted, that children or relatives of employers or their agents shall not be exempt under this law, and the same shall be included, in, by and under this law.

It shall be the duty of the Commissioner of Labor of the State of Oregon and his assistants, to enforce, without delay, each, any, and every provision of this law; and to prosecute to the fullest extent of the law, each, any, and every violation of each, any and every provision of this law.

Failure of the Labor Commissioner to enforce without delay, each, any and every provision of this law, and to prosecute without delay, each, any and every violator of this law, shall make it mandatory for the Governor of the State of Oregon to dismiss said Labor Commissioner.

This law shall be in force immediately following the passage of same.

The only exemptions allowed by and under this law, shall be in case of accident, breakdown, fire, flood or storm; when in such cases, it shall be legal for any employer, his or her agents, to employ their help for more than eight hours one calendar day; provided, however, that, for each additional hour, or fraction thereof, such help shall receive twice their usual remuneration for each additional hour, or fraction thereof.

Any employer, his or her foreman, overseer, superintendent, manager, or any other agent, who shall fail, neglect, or refuse to comply, and have complied with, each, any and every provision of this law, shall, for each, any and every violation of this law and its provisions, be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars, nor more than one thousand dollars; or not less than thirty days nor more than one year in jail, or both; for each, any and every violation of each, any and every provision of this law.

[Editor's Note: The above proposed amendment to the constitution is indeed a most drastic one, and to us it seems a most unreasonable one. To the dreamer, or to the man who has no other ambition than to hold down a job under some one else, it may appear very fine, but to men and women who are really trying to do things, it will appear, we are sure, as a very foolish proposition. For instance, suppose a physician is called to the home of a poor man, where he is obliged to remain more than eight hours. The increase of wage to the physician after the eighth hour would certainly work a hardship on the poor man and be out of the question. The workings of society may some day be so smooth that a universal eight-hour law will be practical, but for us to jump into a thing of that kind at the present time would be rank foolishness. There seems to be a fanatic endeavor to most seriously abuse the law making power which the people of Oregon now possess, and sometimes these endeavors are successful. We believe the Initiative and Referendum and the Recall are fine laws, but they will become a bore the same as anything else that is misused, and for that reason we should throw about these splendid laws more protection against freak legislation.]
