EGGS TO BE PROUD OF

"Look at these eight eggs—balancing those twelve," said a keeper of back-bird poultry in Portland to a representative of the Oregon Agricultural College. As he spoke he pointed to an evenly-bung balance with eight large Black Minorca eggs on one side and twelve highly varied specimens on the other. Of course the speaker was a Minorca enthusiast and it is just possible that he did some culling in assembling both lots of eggs; but the Minorca product was remarkably large, white, round and uniform, even for Minorca eggs, though the owner would not agree to that. "There's no finer egg sight in the world," he concluded, "than eggs of these birds, looking like a row of snow-balls; and the sight is prettiest when the eggs are 60 cents a dozen."

The directors of the Sheridan Fruit Growers' Association have within the past few days purchased a three-acre tract of land on which to erect an up-to-date plant for the handling of fruit, berries, nuts and vegetables. A shipping and storage warehouse will be built at once and other buildings will follow as needed. The location has 500 feet of railroad siding and is close to the business center of the town.
